SA & Australian squash great Vicki Cardwell will be one of the first 20 South Australian sporting luminaries to be in-ducted into the new SA Sports Hall of fame.

In a glittering ceremony to take place at the Adelaide Convention Centre on Sat November 20, Vicki will join the likes of Lisa Ondieki (Athletics), Simon Fairweather (Archery), Sir Donald Bradman (Cricket), Gillian Rolton (Equestrian), Phil Smyth (Basketball), Bart Cummings (Horse Racing) and many other household names.

South Australia has produced a number of Australia's squash greats including Doug Stephenson, Jan Miller, Glen Brumby, Dan Jenson, Byron Davis and Chris Dittmar.
