Effective January 1, 2005

- 1. THERE SHOULD BE SUFFICIENT TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS. FOR THERE TO BE SUFFICIENT TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS, EACH STUDENT, INCLUDING ENGLISH LEARNERS MUST HAVE A TEXTBOOK AND/OR INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS TO USE IN CLASS AND TO TAKE HOME TO COMPLETE REQUIRED HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS.**

ALSO

- 2. SCHOOL FACILITIES MUST BE CLEAN, SAFE, AND MAINTAINED IN GOOD REPAIR. GOOD REPAIR MEANS THAT THE FACILITY IS MAINTAINED IN A MANNER THAT ASSURES THAT IT IS CLEAN, SAFE AND FUNCTIONAL AS DETERMINED BY THE STATE OFFICE OF PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION.**
