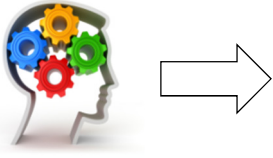
مُعَلِّمٌ – مُعَلِّمَةٌ

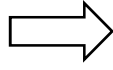

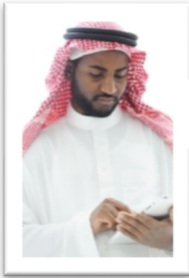

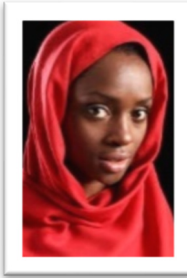
