Session summaries

IF “TECHNOLOGY” IS THE ANSWER, WHAT WAS THE QUESTION?

With the overwhelming number of new technologies appearing in the education space, it is increasingly important to understand the impact these have on our students’ learning. Learning technologies must enable creative and innovative capabilities in our students. This session focuses on principles from the Manifesto 15 initiative (manifesto15.org), and integrates global perspectives gained from the Knowmad Society and Invisible Learning projects.

DISRUPTING HIGHER EDUCATION

With rising student loan debt, freezes and reductions of state subsidies, and a widening skills gap in the U.S. workforce, pressures are mounting on all institutions of higher education to be clear about the value of a college degree. This session will offer insights into the concept of disruptive innovation and what it means for the future of higher education.

DIGITAL RESOURCES FOR EVERY STUDENT – PROVEN IMPACT AND BENEFITS

This session will discuss the results of providing every student on campus with digital resources. It will cover the processes involved in an institutional solution, where students’ textbooks are provided through a unified end to end digital portal.

Issues related to assessing new course level fees, the impact on the College’s bookstore, and how to manage the deployment of close to 100,000 digital resources.

EDUCATION 3.0: HOW DO WE PERSONALIZE EDUCATION AT SCALE?

This presentation will focus on ways to create multi-nodal and multi-modal connections based on effective practices from practitioners around the globe. This session will consist of examples (both in-person and eLearning) that promote social learning, transformative learning, game based learning, and learning based on cognitive science. Attendees will know how to create better (more authentic) MOOCs, simulation, curriculum integration events, authentic assessment, and problem based learning experiences within an eLearning framework.

PROMISING TECHNOLOGIES, CREATIVITY & TEACHING: TEN TOOLS AND TRENDS

This fast-paced session will run through trends and emerging technologies, sprinkled with some “Fact or Fantasy” interactions that will rattle your mind. Topics include maker spaces, avoiding flipped classroom “flops”, the 3D printer phenomena, and more. Replicable examples will reveal imaginative, thought provoking ways to use these technologies.

RICHARD CULATTA – DEPUTY DIRECTOR, OFFICE OF EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY, US DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Richard Culatta is a leader in the field of educational innovation with experience in K-12, higher education, and workplace learning environments. In his role as the Director of the Office of Educational Technology for the US Department of Education he focused on leveraging technology to create personalized learning experiences for all students and promoting increased connectivity to improve access to education and make college more affordable. Prior to joining the Department of Education, he served as an education policy advisor to U.S. Senator Patty Murray.

He recently taught EdStartup 101, a massive open online course (MOOC) to support educational entrepreneurs in developing the next generations of apps and services for teachers and learners.

DR. MICHELLE R. WEISE – EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR,
THE INNOVATION LAB AT SOUTHERN NEW
HAMPSHIRE UNIVERSITY

Michelle Weise, Ph.D., helps institutions and their leaders navigate the dynamics of disruption across a rapidly changing academic terrain.

Weise, Executive Director of the Innovation Lab at Southern New Hampshire University, specializes in disruptive innovation in higher education. Weise's seminal book – "Hire Education: Mastery, Modularization, and the Workforce Revolution," co-authored with Clayton Christensen – unveils the tectonic shifts to come, and discusses how online competency-based education will revolutionize the workforce and disrupt higher education.

Weise's research also delves into student-learning outcomes, assessments, and public-private partnerships. Her voice has been featured in all major education publications, including the New England Journal of Higher Education, The Chronicle of Higher Education, Inside Higher Ed, as well as top-tier business outlets, such as Harvard Business Review, The Economist, Bloomberg BusinessWeek and USA Today.

DR. JOHN MORAVEC – FOUNDER, EDUCATION FUTURES LLC

John Moravec is a scholar on the future of work and education; a global speaker; editor of the Knowmad Society project; a co-director of the Invisible Learning project; and he is the founder of Education Futures LLC.

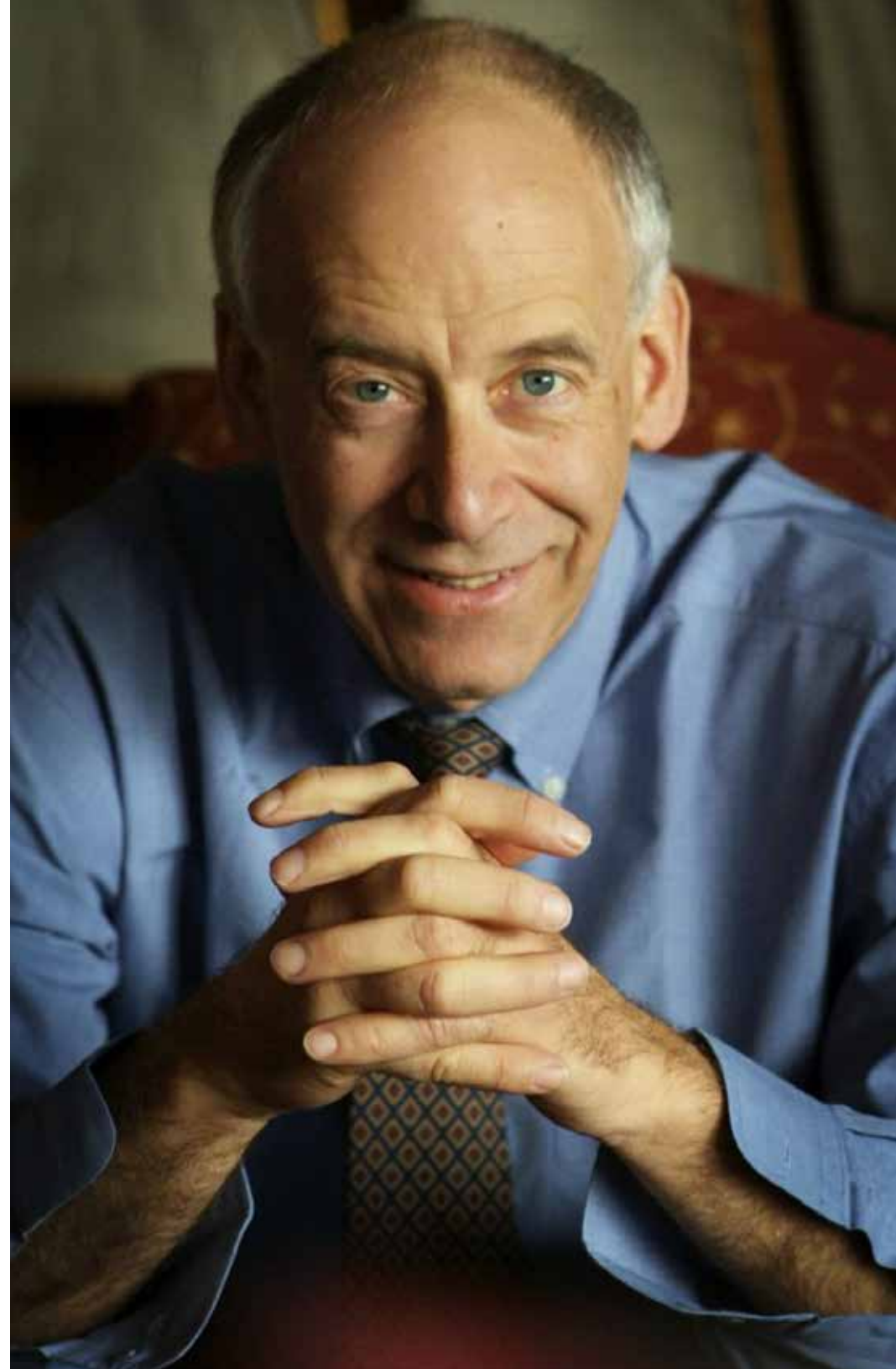
His research and action scholarship agendas are focused on exploring the convergence of globalization, innovation society, and accelerating change in human knowledge development; and, building positive futures for knowledge creation systems in an era of exponential uncertainty. His work focuses on exploring the emerging “Knowmad Paradigm,” and the new approaches to leadership and human capital development required. In addition to editing Knowmad Society (2013, Education Futures), he is the co-author of the book Invisible Learning (2011, University of Barcelona Press).

NOVEMBER LEARNING

Alan November is an international leader in education technology. He has helped schools, governments and industry leaders improve the quality of education through technology.

Alan was named one of the nation's fifteen most influential thinkers of the decade by Classroom Computer Learning Magazine. In 2001, he was listed one of eight educators to provide leadership into the future by the Eisenhower National Clearinghouse. His writing includes numerous articles and the best-selling book, *Empowering Students with Technology*. Alan was co-founder of the Stanford Institute for Educational Leadership Through Technology and is most proud of being selected as one of the original five national Christa McAuliffe Educators.

DR. JEFF BORDEN – CHIEF INNOVATION OFFICER,
SAINT LEO UNIVERSITY

Dr. Jeff D Borden is the 'Chief Innovation Officer' at Saint Leo University. For two decades, Jeff has focused on trying to transform higher education. Jeff worked as a Vice President with Pearson Education, providing an academic vision and strategy that encompassed digital learning, neo-millennial methods, authentic assessment, and beyond. As the Center for eLearning Director, Jeff pursued rigorous research opportunities as he led the 'think tank' of educational innovation. During that time Dr. Borden consulted with educators in every U.S. state, led transformative efforts in 34 countries, provided almost 100 keynote presentations to audiences of 100-10,000 almost weekly.

In Dr. Borden's current role at Saint Leo (Associate VP of Learning Innovation and Academic Technology), he is creating a learning innovation incubator and promoting transformational and effective practices, at scale, that are research driven. These strategies tie back to Jeff's platform of "Education 3.0" – the confluence of neuroscience, learning design, and education technology.
