President and General Manager's Report

Strategic Direction

In October 2011, the Board attended a two day Strategic Planning Workshop, to review the 2010 to 2013 Strategic Plan. In November 2011, reflective of the outcomes of the workshop, we made a decision to decrease operational costs. The driver behind the reduction of the Squash SA operating spend was twofold:

- 1 To introduce a model that would see participation driven by Member Clubs and Venue Operators via programs, and supported by Squash SA services
- 2 To free up cash flow in order to pay down the current loan liabilities

A Business Plan was prepared and implemented, whereby projects were tasked to staff with set budgets and timeframes, to ensure Squash SA remained focused on delivering against the Strategic Plan's four Key Strategic Directions:

- 1 Increase Participation and Membership
- 2 Improvement of Facilities
- 3 Game and Player Development
- 4 Governance and Administration

To achieve the reduction in operating costs the organisation was restructured, which resulted in reduced staffing levels in the areas of Pathways, Marketing and Development.

Participation and Membership

Over the past 12 months the introduction of the Online Player Registration System has provided Squash SA with a mechanism that can collect participation data in order to build the Association's corporate knowledge around participation numbers and trends.

It is pleasing to see results which show a growth in Club affiliation numbers from 34 to 39, with some categories of participation showing a trend in participation growth.

- The average attendance at Junior Club Programs (including Country), has increased from 94 (Term 4, 2011) to 141 (Term 1, 2012).
- The number of participants in the High Schools Competition has increased from 167 in 2011 to 214 in 2012.
- The number of Squad Members in the Performance Pathways program has increased in the Emerging Athlete Squad from four to six and State Junior Development Squad from 18 to 25.

The traditional paradigm for pennant competition numbers remains consistent, and again our challenge is whether the current competition structure and format is conducive to attracting new players.

Facilities

The Association's licenced venue, Racquets SA, has felt the impact of a declining economic market over the past 12 months. A series of financial and industry setbacks has needed to be overcome including the aftermath of the gaming room ceiling collapse, non-payment by our Insurers for the ceiling repair and interruption to business insurance claim, limited consumer discretionary spend particularly on leisure/entertainment activities, and Industry uncertainty regarding mandatory pre-commitment.


The General Manager (GM) investigated TAB and KENO as new revenue streams for Racquets SA. Neither option was viable based on existing bar trade and setup fees. The Board and GM also investigated the sale of two Gaming Machine Entitlements (GME) in line with the Racquets SA Efficiency and Economy strategy, prepared by BRM Holdich. The sale of the two GMEs would have paid the loan liabilities, however the machines were not purchased by the market on the GME trade day.

In terms of Squash Facility Development, the GM (in conjunction with the Barossa Council) coordinated the official opening of the Barossa Squash Courts by Chris Dittmar, attracting media coverage and community profile.

Squash SA has been included as a key stakeholder in the Onkaparinga Council's Recreation Strategy. This has resulted in the Onkaparinga Strategy identifying future squash courts at the Seaford Recreation Centre and Aberfoyle Park Hub Recreation Centre. Design plans for four new courts at the Seaford Recreation Centre have been prepared and Squash SA will lobby Onkaparinga Council to incorporate the courts in the Seaford Development Master Plan.

In addition, Adelaide City Council, Onkaparinga Council, City of Holdfast Bay and Tea Tree Gully Council have each supported Squash SA's concept to develop an outdoor multi-court, which would see squash played in urban spaces/parklands and link unstructured participation to centres and clubs. Funding has been provided by the Office for Recreation and Sport to design the outdoor multi-court in conjunction with the above Councils.





Over the past 12 months, the Board, Finance and Audit Advisory Committee, Facilities Advisory Committee and the GM have explored a number of facility development opportunities and capital projects:

- o Adelaide City Beach Volleyball Site lease land to build a city squash centre
- o Campbelltown Leisure Centre squash courts build
- Hendon Squash Centre purchase
- 440 Goodwood Road property purchase
- Seaford Recreation Centre squash courts build
- Racquets SA exterior and interior refurbishment

It was determined that the priority would be to repay the loan and build cash reserves before further capital outlay would take place. The longstanding loan liability of the South Adelaide Squash Centre was also settled. The building loan was paid out in full by the SA Masters Squash Association and separated from Squash SA. The SRASA balance sheet liability was reduced by \$289,236.

Game and Player Development

In addition to the ORS Step 1 grant, Squash SA sourced \$4,000 funding from ORS for the SASRAPID Squash program and a further \$2,500 funding from the City of Salisbury to deliver squash programs.

During 2012 Squash SA prepared funding applications that will see the following new projects funded, and rolled out over the 2012/2013 financial year:

- o Women's Participation and Development Strategy
- o Outdoor, Get Moving, Multi Court Feasibility and Design Study
- o Performance Pathways underpinning funding
- o Core Business funding government commitment for three years

In 2012, Squash SA and Racquets SA conducted an independent member satisfaction survey with our key stakeholders. The survey results were pleasing, and are a credit to the customer service delivery and relationships that have been established by Squash SA and Racquets SA staff with our membership and external stakeholders.

- 95.1% of members surveyed were satisfied to extremely satisfied with their overall dealings with Squash SA Administration
- 90% of Racquets SA Members surveyed were satisfied with the overall level of customer service

On 17 June, 160 people attended the 2012 Gala Dinner held at the Sanctuary, Adelaide Zoo. The event provided a great chance to reflect upon many of the remarkable achievements of the Squash and Racquetball Community, its players, administrators, coaches and officials. The Gala Dinner incorporated the 2012 Awards, and provided an opportunity for us all to celebrate the wonderful achievements of our sports over the past 12 months.

2012 also saw the launch of a fresh look 'Play Squash' Web Video which was published by Indaily, Adelaide's independent daily newspaper. The web clip attracted 430 web hits of which 136 visited Squash SA's general enquiries email.

Governance and Administration

The Board and GM have worked through a series of reviews to ensure we are operating efficiently and effectively in an ever changing industry and economic climate.

Some of the key Governance and Administration strategies addressed over the past 12 months include:

- Talented & Emerging Athlete Program review

In closing, we would like to recognise Squash SA's major partners – the State Government of South Australia, and Racquets SA, our Licenced Bar Gaming and Bistro Venue. We would also like to extend our gratitude to our Major Tournament sponsors Maggie Beer Products, Barossa Valley Toyota, and the 2012 Gala Dinner Supporters - Nippy's Fruit Juice, Rebel Sport, St Hallett Barossa, Profix Melrose Park, Rackets and Strings, Reilly's Clare Valley and Simeone Financial Services.

Comments from the Board

As we all know there are many challenges facing squash and racquetball growth in South Australia. Squash SA's Facilities Enhancement Grants and major development programs are an integral part of our strategic plan to improve facilities and increase participation of squash and racquetball. The significant contribution made by Squash SA to the \$17m development of the Barossa Aquatic and Recreation Centre "The Rex" is a great example of how we are delivering on that promise. It's because of these facility upgrades that we were able to win the hosting rights for the 2014 and 2015 Australian Racquetball Championships which are being held outside of Victoria for the first time at The Rex. We have seen growth in country squash participation and through our grants program have improved a number of squash facilities. The Board and staff have introduced a survey format that consulted with former and current pennant competition players which is increasing our knowledge of player needs. George DeVizio

I think that Squash SA staff have done a wonderful job this year to achieve external funding, sponsorships and press coverage in a climate saturated by high-profile sports that get a lot of media attention. Despite government cutting grant funding generally, we were able to obtain its support to increase women's and girl's participation. This is a 'new' grant of \$20,000 and demonstrates the Office of Recreation and Sport's confidence in Squash SA's directions.

Our tournament in the fantastic new development at the Barossa attracted several new significant sponsors in its first year, and the Gala Dinner format also provided sponsors with something exciting to be associated with. Already staff are building on the potential for this sponsorship to expand. Obtaining some press coverage has been an achievement in itself! It has been particularly pleasing as it has highlighted the growing accomplishments of SA's number one player Mike Corren who is working with Squash SA to continue to support and promote squash in our state. There were some great achievements over the past 12 months with the opening of the Barossa Rex Centre – the first squash courts built in SA for over a decade with state of the art facilities. It was also great to see feedback from the survey shows that players are very happy with Squash SA administration. Alissa Proctor

The Board and Squash SA have achieved major milestones this year in the face of a recession and our challenging environment. The thing I want to convey to our members and others is that we stand resolute in rejuvenating squash in this state on all levels from competition through to clubs through to officials. Our challenges moving forward are to innovate ways to increase participation in squash on all levels in all departments, and we must continue to remain positive in the face of environmental negativity. The Board and Squash SA have shown this year that they are willing to fight fiercely against the face of adversity and come through with sustainable and long lasting growth strategies. Alex Ryan

With lower than expected performance of the Racquets Bistro due to a downturn in the industry there was a need to scale back on the spending of Squash SA operations. Management and the Board identified cost saving measures that could be implemented. Squash SA contributed \$250,000 towards the state of the art multi-use squash courts in the Barossa Valley, securing 21 year access to the courts and ensures that squash takes its rightful place within Regional South Australia. We have also secured approximately \$80,000 of new funding from sponsorships and government. Philip Teale



















Junior Camps Achievements

- 32 junior players attended the 2012 Junior Development Squad Summer Camp held at Impact Health Club. The Camp was designed for the more serious junior to improve their squash and to become eligible for Development Squad selection
- o Camps were run by Squash SA Development Officers in conjunction with Coaching Pool members



Barossa Report

The key achievements during the 2011/12 year included:

Junior Club Program

Barossa Valley Squash Club has weekly training for eight primary students and five high school students. The juniors have come from the schools program which included 260 primary students and 90 high school students for an average of three visits. The six new glass backed courts in a new multi-use centre has helped greatly in the retention of these juniors.

Matrix

Grant Norman to be thanked for introducing the Matrix to the Club. The system enables the Club to record results and promote the results in the local papers. Players have found the Matrix grading an interesting aspect to competition watching their results increase or decrease their rating according to how they performed. It certainly made grading teams a straight forward process.

Tournaments

The Rex was opened on 7 November 2011 by Chris Dittmar. The opening showcased a doubles Tournament - 24 pairs played a one day Event on four Doubles courts (four feet wider) thanks to moveable walls.

On 8 – 10 June 2012 the PSA / WSA Barossa Valley Toyota Open and the SA Graded was a success due to excellent Club support and a generous local sponsor, Barossa Valley Toyota.

The challenges for the 2012/13 year include:

Juniors

Juniors transition into Junior Tournaments and Club Pennant Competition. To introduce a new night of competition to cater for the demand of juniors transitioning into Club Pennant.

Barossa Valley Squash Club

Barossa Valley Squash Club to become a 'giant' in South Australian squash. Currently, the Club has a very productive management that caters for Competition players and supports Juniors and Tournaments. I would like to see all aspects of the Club grow with more members and helpers. With a State 2 team in the Adelaide Pennant Competition, the Club has a high benchmark to maintain.

Coaches

Coaches are essential for growth. I would like to see a 'trainee' development coach succeed in 2013 and get plenty of help from the three experienced coaches at the Club. Of course, enrolling new talent into Level 1 Coaches Courses would be greatly encouraged.

Country Coordination Report

The key achievements during the 2011/12 year included:

- Affiliations with Squash SA increased to 11 (2011: 10) with the addition of the Broken Hill Squash Club 0
- The number of clubs utilising the Matrix now totals 10 (2011: 5) with 550 players registered on the 0 Matrix (2011: 300)
- The number of qualified coaches increased to five (2011: three) with the addition of coaches in Loxton and Naracoorte. In addition, a coaching seminar was presented over two days to seven regional school teachers in Broken Hill
- The number of junior programs increased to four (2011: three) with the addition of a program in Loxton. The average total number of children participating in the four programs increased to 70 (2011: 45)
- The number of junior tournaments increased to three (2011: one) with two held in Clare and one in Millicent
- Also, one senior tournament was held in Loxton, being the Riverland Classic 0

The challenges for the 2012/13 year include:

- Increase the number of players participating in junior and senior tournaments 0
- Provide support to those clubs running junior programs to help increase the number of children participating in the programs
- Help with the establishment of new junior programs in Port Pirie and Burra 0

Back on the Ball Report

The Back on the Ball program aims to track weight loss for at risk and severely overweight youths through participation in modified racquet sports such as squash and racquetball.

Over the course of the year, ten young people participated in the program which saw physical activity monitored and calorie loss, measured by University Medical Students. The students also measured and analyzed satisfaction levels and program retention in racquet sport activity versus attending a Fitness Centre for exercise / physical activity. The program represented a 70% retention rate.

Dr Sanjeev Khurana (State 3, Next Generation) has driven the program and encouraged youths considering lap band surgery to enrol in Back on the Ball for their long term gain. A few participants have become squash enthusiasts and now practice regularly and will not be far away from participating in Pennant.

Ingle Farm, Christies Beach, South Adelaide, Next Generation, Norwood and West Adelaide Squash Centres have generously donated court hire to facilitate this program.

Will Gray, Ruth Rainsford, Matt Hobba and Des Panizza have provided the on court coaching, physical training and encouragement. Squash with physical training adapted to the limits of the individual has seen Back on the Ball achieve results.

Squash SA welcomed several new clubs in 2012, taking the number of our affiliated club from 34 to 39. The Squash SA Board and Staff extend a warm welcome to new affiliated members - the University of SA, University of Adelaide, The Hack Army, Mannum Leisure Centre and the REX, Barossa Valley.

Facility Enhancement Grant Scheme

We acknowledge the hard working clubs and centres who took on the challenge of upgrading and completing their facilities enhancement projects. The following clubs won grants from Squash SA to assist their projects. Norwood Squash Centre - Club Room Upgrade, Millicent Squash Club - Club Room Expansion, South Adelaide - Air-conditioning, Walkerville YMCA - Perspex Doors and signage, Gawler Squash Club - Painting and cleaning floors, Loxton Squash Club - Club Room Upgrade.

Participation Growth, Online Registration

2012 saw healthy participation growth in South Australia particularly in the social and casual use of courts. The table on page 14 represents participation numbers of individuals over the past 12 months. These figures do not indicate the frequency of individual's court usage at centres.

The Australian Sports Commission intends to collate figures for national participation rates of sports under the categories Full Active Member, Program Participants, Event Participants, School Managed Competitions and School Delivered Programs. These figures are to be supplied by State Sporting Associations.

The introduction of the online player system by Squash SA in 2012 enables the Association to collect accurate data for casual, competition and school participation and pass this information onto the Government.

Customer Satisfaction Survey

Squash SA is constantly looking for ways to improve service quality and member satisfaction. 2012 saw the introduction of a customer satisfaction survey which surveyed three areas relevant to the Association: The Board, Squash SA Administration and Venues/Courts. The survey assisted to set a benchmark, and to assist the Association to further understand:

- How our members view the organisation
- o Our players knowledge of the organisation
- o What is important to our members


The survey results indicated an overall high level of satisfaction. The survey results are published on the Squash SA website, with some results also published on Page 8 of this Annual Report.

The Racquets SA Bistro was re-modelled which involved removing the stage and reconfiguring the table floor plan in order to make way for a new Lounge and unstructured Dining Space for patrons. A Play Station console was introduced for children to enhance the experience for families dining in the Bistro. Both initiatives have proved to be extremely successful and popular with patrons.

Monday and Tuesday evening Darts Competition is a new activity that has been introduced to build capacity and patronage to the Club. To date we have two teams and all indications suggest this will increase next season. In addition, Racquets SA has re-invented our partnership with the Adelaide Rock'n'Roll Club to promote regular live music and entertainment. Pennant Committee Report

Pennant numbers have remained steady over the past year, with 511 players in Spring 2011 (104 teams) and 515 players in Autumn 2012 (105 teams). On average an extra 80 players per season reserved in the pennant competition.

Achievements

Player behaviour has been very impressive over the past year, with few reports of misconduct reaching the Committee. We believe a significant part of this has been the increased education and confidence in refereeing gleaned from attendance at the Pennant Player Referee Accreditation sessions and we hope that this good behaviour continues into the future.

Following from this, the Committee and Squash SA are very pleased with the new Tribunal system put in place, to which we owe NSW Squash a great deal of gratitude. Moving away from the paternalistic, intimidatory 'Tribunal only' concept to a system which gives both complainor and complainee the chance to write to a neutral Commissioner who in turn offers a warning, suspended sentence or sentence based on the testimonies with the option to go to a Tribunal if unhappy with the original sentence offered. Of course, we hope we don't need to use the system at all!

The successful retention of 17 divisions up from 15 a few years ago has been very pleasing to the Committee. Although four team competitions are naturally not preferred and we would ideally love to see only 8-team competitions, ensuring an even competition is crucial and finding the appropriate balance between these oft competing aims is a welcome challenge at our seasonal Committee meetings. Moving towards North and South divisions is a future hope if and when we see an increase in teams as travel times remain a concern for players.

Challenges

One of the major challenges for Pennant in the future is to combat the aging Squash base. The average age of Pennant players is in the low forties and we are seeing an ever increasing turnover of players as family and work commitments and injuries take their toll. One of the particular concerns here is that we have fewer players under 20 years of age than we did 2-3 years ago; however there has been a marginal increase in players in the 20 to 30 age range. Given the strong indications of improvement emanating from Squash SA regarding junior development, we can only hope that as these young players reach their late teens and early twenties we see a significant spike in younger players entering pennant competition.

Finding reserves continues to present a challenge to Clubs, even with the Committee endeavouring to be as flexible as possible, especially for smaller Clubs which have so few players to access. We believe there is a vast network of untapped social players interested in merely reserving rather than playing a full season and developing a system to introduce these players into Pennant is a crucial challenge for the Committee and Squash SA over the next few years.

Unfortunately, our Premier League competition has only four teams this coming season down from seven just three seasons ago. We have moved to a centre based format this season to add some atmosphere, but still allowed players to represent their respective Clubs. Unless this slide in team numbers can be addressed, it will be necessary to consider alternate arrangements including possibly a move to a matrix based system, which would be an unfortunate step to take. Premier League has a higher player turnover rate than most other divisions, and addressing this will be a significant step towards ensuring our top division can move towards becoming a strong, even, 8-team competition once again.

Racquetball Report

Squash SA Performance Pathways - Emerging Athlete Squad

In July 2011, Emerging Athlete Funding Program was replaced by the Emerging Athlete Squad (EAS).

This change was the result of the Performance Pathways Model review, which included coaches, parents, Junior Advisory Committee members, staff and a specialist consultant. The review group were unanimous in the recommendation to the Board that athletes would benefit more from the program, with greater opportunity/access to personalised coaching, better access to training facilities, periodised training programs and some funding available for travel to tournaments.

The Emerging Athlete Squad currently consists of six junior athletes that receive Squash SA assistance and coaching. Each Athlete aspires towards National Rankings, National Squad Representation and AIS scholarships within the Squash Australia Performance Pathways Framework.







Finance Report

Racquets SA Operating Profit increased by \$17,000 to \$637,713 compared to 2010/11.

The Bar figures do not look very flattering but the treatment of discount drinks to members last year (Approx. \$46,000) was varied and is offset by a reduction in Promotional costs in Gaming (down from \$155,671 to \$99,630).

Repairs and Maintenance costs (Administration) increased by \$21,000 due to the ceiling collapsing in the gaming room with our insurers refusing to cover the damage. The matter was raised with the Internal Disputes Panel, and the decision has not been overturned. Racquets plans to take the matter up with an independent loss adjustor to pursue the claim. The ceiling repairs also interrupted and affected our gaming income for several days.

Land Tax for 2011 (\$17,000) is under review with the Government and at this stage the 2012 levy has not been determined. Gas and Electricity charges at the Club increased by 14% from \$49,000 to \$55,000 in line with state wide energy charging increases.

Net Squash SA costs reduced by \$47,807 to \$690,789 due to a staffing restructure in the Pathways and Marketing portfolios. Squash Admin net costs rose by \$55,000 due mainly to rent (\$20,000) and Consultancy Costs (\$18,000), which included the CBRE Facilities Report, Seaford Recreation Centre Concept Plans, and Strategic Planning and Workshops.

Development costs were reduced by \$10,000 while the Pennant bottom line increased by \$12,000 due to increased player insurance costs (\$13,500) because of the late receipt of the invoice for the 2010/2011 financial year.

The Association's Current Liabilities are up \$207,624 including \$137,500 owing to the Barossa Council for the Rex Centre Courts and an increase in trade creditors of \$50,000.

Of concern are the capital repayments and bank charges due in 2012/13 on the ANZ loan taken out to cover the Rex Centre and the Commercial Bill (car park). Payments for 2012/2013 are outlined below.

This amount of \$320,000 needs to be funded in 2012/13 before net Squash Operational costs are taken into account.


It should be noted that the ANZ Loan and Commercial Bill have been included in the Balance Sheet as Current Liabilities. This is in line with Australian Accounting Standards which requires loans to be reported accordingly if the Association does not have the legal right to defer payments.

Members Equity increased by \$235,000 with the South Adelaide Squash Centre liability (\$289,236) being removed.
