*Dewey Does Sports song is playing as the opening credits dribble by. The camera goes from outside of Doesville into Dewey Does' room. Panning across Dewey's room as he's sleeping in his bed, showing his sports posters, a banner that reads 'Heroes Start as 110% Kids', his sports blanket, all of his sports equipment, a picture of his dad, his trademark long billed baseball cap hanging from his bed banister, head logo football helmet, socks hanging out his dresser, Dewey Does 110 silhouette logo poster and Optiks sitting on the dresser reading a book on sports safety. **Your logo prominently displayed in Dewey Does' bedroom and during credits.***

Dewey Does wakes up to the sounds of his sports equipment friends and his mother's morning wakeup call. It's another school day in Doesville.

MS. DOES

(Voice traveling up the stairs and under Dewey's bedroom door)

Dewey, time to wake up and smell the day.

CROSS OVER

(He yells out as he pops out the sports chest toward the window at the foot of Dewey's bed)

Give me ALL three of those!

FIRST DOWN

(With his hard Texas accent, yells out right after Cross Over)
No pain, no gain!

H.R.

(He yells out right after First Down)
It's, It's, It's, It's outta here!

BEND-IT
(Bend-It sings out his
never ending goal call)
Goooooooooooooooooooooooooooooooooal

FLAT TOP
(He says with a smile hanging
out the chest with his front
wheels spinning)
110 Dudes

MS. LOVE
(Showing off her beautiful
strings very tight and straight)
Tennis, anyone?

CRICKET
(Jumping out the chest)
Bah, bah, bah, bah, bah.....

SPEEDY & FIFTH GEAR
(Their shoe strings pointing
upward like lightning bolts
in front of Dewey's bed)
Time to wake up Boss mon.

OPTIKS
(Looking over the top of the newspaper)
Another day, another lesson Dewey

DEWEY DOES
(Sitting up in bed)
I know but
why can't school
just be about playing
sports all day?

OPTIKS
(Still looking over the top of the newspaper)
Wishful thinking again Dewey?

DEWEY DOES
(Sitting up with his feet on the floor
wiping the sleep from his eyes)
I can learn a lot from sports.

All the sports equipment bouncing around, moving about the room and stretching as if they are getting ready for a game or competition.

OPTIKS

(Looking over at all the sports equipment)
(With sarcastic eyes above his goggles)
You sure about that Dewey?

DEWEY DOES

(Not really paying attention to Optiks)
Huh?

OPTIKS

(Looking back in the newspaper)
Never mind.

CROSS OVER

(Looking up at Optiks from the floor)
Did I just hear a dig from you?

FIRST DOWN

(Hitting his helmet against the
side of the sports chest)
Don't listen to him.
He's all hat and no cattle.

DEWEY DOES

(Sitting up on his bed)
Guys, can't we all get along?

OPTIKS

(Back to reading the newspaper)
Dewey, this says the Stape Twins
are running for class president
unopposed.

DEWEY DOES

(Looking up at Optiks with a I'm
not sure what you mean look)
Huh?

OPTIKS

Means nobody is running against
them for class president.

CROSS OVER

(Bouncing up and down looking
out the bedroom window)
Boss, why don't you run against them?

DEWEY DOES
(Looking over at the window)
No way.

OPTIKS
(Looking over top of the newspaper)
As regretful as this may sound,
I'm on Cross Over's side.
You should run against them.

CROSS OVER
(Suddenly stops bouncing)
I heard that.

DEWEY DOES
(Head facing down)
No way guys,
I have enough pressure
to deal with.

OPTIKS
I have to ask.
What kind of pressure
does a nine-year-old have?

DEWEY DOES
(Looking up toward his friends)
Guys, I don't like pol, poli..

OPTIKS
Are you trying to say, politics.

DEWEY DOES
Yes and I don't like p-o-l-i-tics

OPTIKS
(Putting down the newspaper)
Dewey, let me draw a picture for you.

Dewey looking up at Optiks

OPTIKS
Our youth...so naïve.

DEWEY DOES

As Optiks starts teaching Dewey about politics, Dewey begins imagining the Stape Twins running Doesville.

OPTIKS
The Stape Twins are now
your class president and
then...

DISSOLVE TO:

Dewey Does having visions of the Stape Twins running Doesville; Soda and candy machines appearing all over the school and around Doesville, kids playing video games instead of actual physical games or being physically active. Kids becoming couch potatoes around Doesville, empty baseball fields, football fields, hockey arenas and handball courts; the look and feel of a deserted town with no kids playing anything.

DISSOLVE TO:

A close up of Dewey Does listening to Optiks but now with a concerned look then switching to Optiks.

OPTIKS
(Looking at Dewey Does)
It's your choice Dewey,
but politics has a way
of changing things.

CROSS OVER
(Still bouncing by the window)
I was gonna run for POTUS
after my basketball career
but I was told I wasn't
constitutionally legal.

OPTIKS
(Looking at Cross Over)
This guy...

CROSS OVER
(Looking back at Optiks)
What?
A basketball can't dream?

CUT TO:

FRONT OF HORTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL – DAY/MORNING

Dewey Does walking into Martha Horton Elementary school with his sports equipment in tow in his book bag and to his surprise.

DEWEY DOES
(With an amazed look)
What?
