## Community

The California Military Institute serves the city of Perris and the surrounding communities of the Inland Empire. The school opened with 50 7th grade students in 2003 and has now reached a population of 1020 students in grades 5-12 with a waiting list at most grade levels. The Corps of Cadets is co-ed with male and female students each at 50%. Ethnicity is as follows; 84% Hispanic, 6% African American, 6 % white and 5% others. 94% of the cadets participate in the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program, although the school takes no Title I funds. The school received its first WASC accreditation in 2009. In 2016, CMI earned a California Gold Ribbon School Distinction.

## California Cadet Corp



CMI is affiliated with the California Cadet Corps (CaCC), which is the JROTC program offered by the California National Guard. The CaCC developed the Military Science curriculum offered to our cadets. CMI is not a "military school" that is for troubled or atrisk cadets. CMI was created to provide educational challenges to cadets who attain a minimum of a 2.0 GPA and have no significant behavioral issues.
