The Aspen Leadership Group is proud to partner with Mercy for Animals in the search for an Estate and Asset Philanthropy Officer. The Estate and Asset Philanthropy Officer will advance the work of Mercy for Animals by building a pipeline of estate and asset prospects through the identification, qualification, cultivation, personal solicitation, and stewardship of a portfolio of 100 donors and donor prospects.

Mercy for Animals is on the front lines—fighting to protect farmed animals. Working in factory farms, corporate boardrooms, and courts of justice, it is speaking up to end cruelty and inspire compassion. Mercy for Animals has three core approaches to achieving its mission. The first is to make alternatives to animal-based meat, eggs, and dairy as attractive and accessible as possible. Mercy for Animals also works to make animal products less competitive and less attractive to consumers, food producers, and policymakers. Finally, Mercy for Animals works to reduce the suffering for animals in the current food system.

Since its first investigation over 20 years ago, Mercy for Animals has made a huge impact for animals through campaigns, storytelling, and the mobilization of thousands of advocates. Through holding governments accountable and pushing for change in laws, Mercy for Animals has saved more than 300,000 animals from the food system in the past three years alone.

Over the next three years, Mercy for Animals plans to expand its work and make greater headway towards its mission of ending industrial animal agriculture and constructing a just and sustainable global food system. The plans include decreasing the number of animals in the food system and reducing the suffering for farmed animals that are trapped in the food system. Mercy for Animals also aims to build people power and increase public awareness of the atrocities of farmed animals to drive change including developing solutions to speed the transition away from industrial animal agriculture.

MERCY FOR ANIMALS' COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY, EQUITY, INCLUSION, AND ANTI-RACISM

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Estate and Asset Philanthropy Officer will

- lead the strategy for Mercy's Meadow, Mercy for Animals' legacy program;
- develop and implement strategy and plans for securing major deferred gifts from donors through
 estate plans (wills and trusts) and gifts of assets (stock, retirement plans, life insurance policies,
 charitable gift annuities, donor-advised funds, art, personal property, real estate);
- serve as an expert, defining gift planning standards, policies, and best practices for the United States and all regions internationally;
- promote Mercy's Meadow to increase the number of estate and asset commitments secured;
- manage a portfolio of estate and asset prospects and donors;
- manage strategy and relationships with FreeWill and other planned giving marketing vendors and platforms;
- work with development staff to develop estate and asset giving as a critical component of the strategic fundraising plan to diversify funding sources;
- present via speaking engagements and planned giving seminars;
- write and produce correspondence, reports, proposals, gift calculations, and marketing materials;
- cultivate and close estate gifts and facilitate giving from assets;
- maintain relationships with donors through regular contact, the provision of annual reports and account statements, and donor recognition events;
- manage a portfolio of approximately 100 estate and asset gift donors;
- create annual strategies for all portfolio donors, including monthly benchmarks and reviews;
- consistently review portfolio, cultivate new prospects, and disqualify as necessary;
- involve philanthropy officers in the cultivation and solicitation process whenever appropriate; and

 maintain donor data and contacts in the fundraising database and prepare funding proposals and stewardship reports.

A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience is required for this position as is at least five years experience in charitable gift planning; financial planning; trust, legal, or estate planning. A law degree is a plus.

LOCATION

This is a remote position that may be performed from any location in the United States.

The salary for this position is \$123,969 to \$140,162 annually.
