She has achieved a career-high singles ranking of no. 144 as of 12 September 2005. Career-high doubles ranking of no. 22 as of 14 May 2012. She has participated in 40 Grand Slams, won one WTA doubles title, three ITF Women's Circuit singles titles and twenty five doubles titles. She holds the record for the most Fed Cup appearances for South Africa – a total of 36! She is known for her variety of play, and volleying ability. Grandin retired from professional tennis January 2015.
