The Development Director, South will lead fundraising for the South, focused primarily on Texas. The Development Director will join the national development team and work closely with the regional program team. The Development Director will support, build, and implement an annual fundraising program for the South as well as participate in national and multi-regional donor relationships in support of the organization's overall annual contributions revenue goals.

Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE) is a global educational nonprofit focused on bringing the power of entrepreneurship to youth in low-income communities. NFTE ignites the entrepreneurial mindset with unique learning experiences that empower students to own their futures. The NFTE community is a diverse group that includes boards made up of business and community leaders, academics, and entrepreneurs. Its staff includes experienced educators, curriculum designers, program managers, and workforce development experts. NFTE supporters are just as diverse—ranging from individual donors to philanthropic foundations to global corporations.

NFTE works with a variety of public and private sector partners to bring its unique brand of experiential, project-based learning to young people. Learners engaged with NFTE are taught by a highly trained Teacher Corps, coached by a dedicated Volunteer Corps, and rewarded by opportunities to earn scholarships and seed capital at a series of annual business plan and pitch competitions. NFTE programs are run in schools, churches, community centers, libraries, and other institutional settings—as well as online. The programs operate in dozens of U.S. states, and 18 countries around the world. Since its founding more than 30 years ago, NFTE has trained thousands of teachers and educated more than a million young people globally.

Through community partnerships, NFTE introduces entrepreneurship education to under-represented learners. Using its evidence-based, award-winning curriculum, NFTE walks learners through the process of creating their own business idea, thus helping students build the skills needed to plan and launch a startup. Students are also introduced to the full range of jobs and occupations available to them and are exposed to new career paths through their work with NFTE. This experience helps students develop an entrepreneurial mindset, learning to think and act like entrepreneurs and demonstrating essential skills like initiative and self-reliance; flexibility and adaptability, critical thinking and problem solving; communication and collaboration; creativity and innovation; opportunity recognition; and future orientation.

Every year thousands of NFTE learners launch successful small businesses. Many NFTE alumni continue to run their business long after they graduate or go on to found new companies that create jobs and drive economic growth. Entrepreneurship education not only changes the lives of NFTE learners, it kickstarts inclusive growth and changes communities.

NFTE helps young people discover their potential and prepares them for future careers. 90% of employers state that it is important that the workforce have the kinds of entrepreneurship skills taught by NFTE and 90% of NFTE alumni state that learning to think like an entrepreneur helped them in school, in business, and in life. The work of Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship has proven essential.

The Development Director, South will

- manage and grow the fundraising portfolio for the South, focused on Texas with the addition of Louisiana and Oklahoma;
- ensure grant and gift deliverables are submitted on time and in the highest quality manner to drive growth and support strong year over year donation renewals and potential upgrades;
- cultivate, solicit, and steward renewal, lapsed, and new donors through well-planned, targeted strategies including prospect research, pitch creation, proposal and appeal writing, meetings, and reporting;
- lead the South Advisory Board in support of community-building, fundraising, and volunteer activities in partnership with the board Chair, Regional Director, Executive Vice President and Chief Advancement Officer, and President and Chief Executive Officer, including upholding a culture of engagement and accountability and new member recruitment;
- implement a regional donor acquisition plan to identify and pursue new corporate, individual, and foundation contributions;
- coordinate fundraising and cultivation events for the South in partnership with the Regional Director and national events team including the Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge finals and other potential events;
- oversee fundraising administration to ensure proper and accurate gift processing, tracking, and reporting internally and externally;
- maintain an accurate regional pipeline using Raiser's Edge CRM including contribution status, deadlines, contacts, actions, and notes;
- ensure proper and timely recognition of donors with ongoing stewardship and relevant programmatic engagement through volunteerism in partnership with the regional program team;
- represent NFTE at regional and national events and programs; and
- be highly knowledgeable of NFTE's goals, program model, culture, and key stakeholders.

LEADERSHIP

Dr. J.D. LaRock

President and Chief Executive Officer

A respected educator, scholar, and policy expert, Dr. J.D. LaRock joined NFTE from the Commonwealth Corporation, Massachusetts' public-private state authority focused on workforce development and regional economic development. As president and CEO of Commonwealth, LaRock chaired Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker's Commission on Digital Innovation and Lifelong Learning, producing a blueprint

for innovative work-based learning models that garnered significant investment from major foundations. Previously he served as a senior education advisor to the late U.S. Senator Ted Kennedy, leading work on the renewal of the federal Higher Education Act, as well as passage of a law that provided \$20 billion in new Pell Grants to college students. As Education Policy Director for former Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick, he helped author a K-12 education law that enabled turnarounds in low-performing school districts and helped the state win \$250 million through the U.S. Department of Education's *Race to the Top* program.

For much of the past decade, LaRock has worked as a teacher, scholar, and university administrator focused on experiential learning, entrepreneurship, and the future of work. As Chief of Staff to the President of Northeastern University, he served on the leadership team that completed the institution's transformation from a commuter college to a top-ranked global research university. He has also served as Professor of the Practice of Law and Policy at Northeastern and as a Fellow with the Aspen Institute's Economic Opportunities program.

LaRock grew up in Queens, New York, in a family of public-school educators, and is a proud graduate of the city's public schools. He went on to earn his bachelor's, master's, and doctorate at Harvard University and his law degree at Georgetown University.

Jane Walsh is an accomplished fundraiser and nonprofit leader with extensive experience leading during times of rapid growth, change management, and transformation. - an ability to connect NFTE's work and partnerships to the larger landscape of inter-related issues within education, workforce development, youth, and economic development;
- excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, and an ability to clearly articulate complex programs, present exciting partnership opportunities, and report on progress and outcomes;
- excellent relationship management skills, both internal and external, and an ability to develop, manage, and grow donor relationships;
- an ability to achieve progressive, measurable results;
- strong organizational skills, a detail-oriented approach, and an ability to embrace new tools, systems, and processes for organizational management and efficiency;
- a customer service orientation; and
- a high degree of personal motivation, sound judgement, and an ability to work both independently and collaboratively across a distributed organization.

NFTE will consider candidates with a broad range of backgrounds. A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience and at least five years of experience in fundraising as a generalist across corporate, foundation, and individual giving, events, and board development is preferred.

SALARY AND BENEFITS

The salary range for this position is \$95,000 to \$120,000 annually. NFTE offers a comprehensive package of benefits including comprehensive health insurance, dental, vision, and life Insurance (fully paid by NFTE); 403(B) Retirement Savings Plan with company match; and generous personal time off.

LOCATION

This is a fully remote position based in Texas. Proximity to the Dallas/Fort Worth metropolitan area will be necessary. Local, regional, and national travel will be required (30-50%).
