

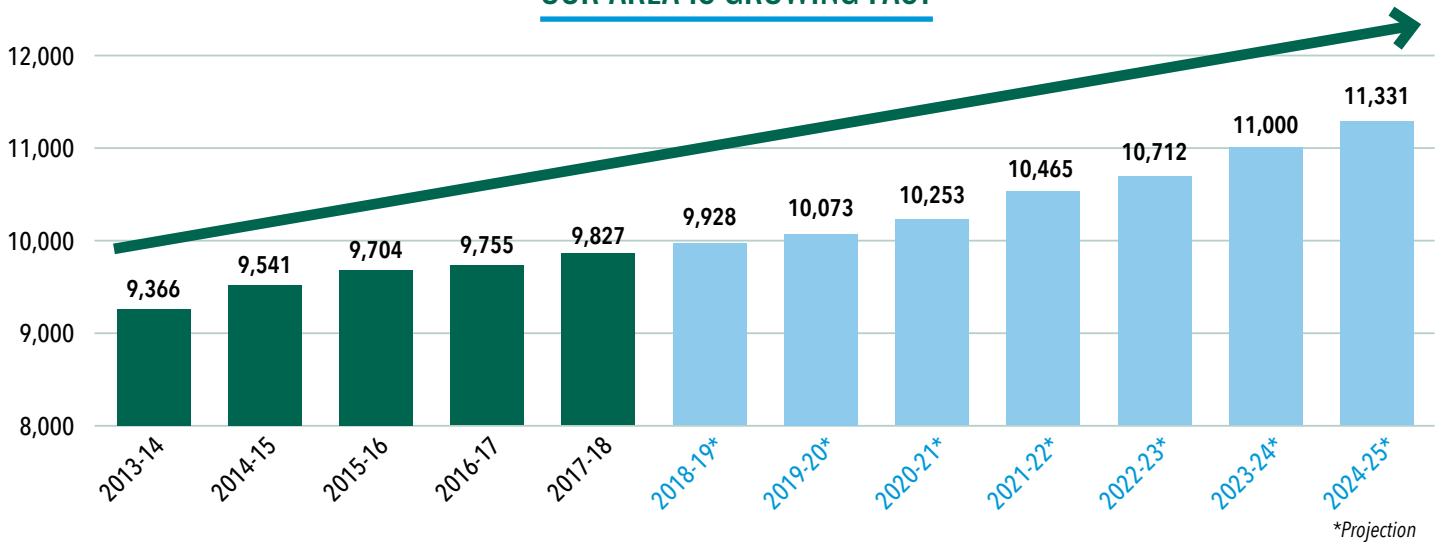

MEASURE W: A LOCAL BOND TO RELIEVE OVERCROWDING

We cannot rely on the State to provide the level of funding needed to relieve overcrowding in our schools. On July 16, the PUHSD Board of Trustees voted unanimously to place Measure W, a \$148 million school improvement measure, on the November 6 ballot. Measure W would provide locally controlled funding entirely dedicated to building and improving local high schools. The cost of Measure W would be limited to no more than \$30 per \$100,000 of assessed value (not market value) annually.

IDENTIFIED NEEDS INCLUDE:

-  Building a new high school in Menifee
-  Completing the final phase of construction at Perris High School
-  Supporting student safety by expanding physical education and athletic facilities
-  Upgrading career training in healthcare, biomedical science and skilled trades
-  Improving access to modern science, technology, engineering, arts and math classrooms

MANDATORY FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY PROVISIONS

-  Funds from Measure W could not be taken by the state or federal government
-  A mandatory project list would outline the use of all funds
-  Annual independent audits and a Citizen's Oversight Committee would be required
-  Measure W funding could not be used for administrators' salaries or benefits
-  Less than \$7 per month for the average homeowner
