PRINCIPAL OPPORTUNITIES

The Senior Associate Vice Chancellor is a critical role for Appalachian State University. Over the last two years, the direct development team has been expanded to twenty-three and restructured for maximum effectiveness. FY2018 fundraising exceeded \$31 million, an increase of nearly 73% over the prior fiscal year. The development team brings excellent expertise and abilities, and is poised to operate at a high level. The SAVC will be the "player-coach" for this team.

Appalachian State University is a premier public undergraduate institution in North Carolina and is consistently ranked as one of the top institutions in the southeastern United States. Total enrollment exceeded 19,000 this fall and interest by prospective students remains very high. The university has very loyal alumni, and interested and engaged leadership boards. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Senior Associate Vice Chancellor for Development will

- lead, supervise, and train a team of development directors that represent different areas of the university, while managing a portfolio of high-level prospects;
- serve as a resource consultant for all development officers to develop joint strategies and solicitations for key major gifts and corporate/foundation prospects with an emphasis on collaboration, teamwork, and open communication;
- provide consultative advice to the Vice Chancellor and senior university administration on advancement issues and direction;
- understand current funding needs of the university and potential funding opportunities of areas of the university through frequent interface with administrators, deans, development officers, and department heads;
- provide institutional guidance on the pursuit of gifts and the pursuit of grants;
- prepare briefing materials, proposal ideas, and solicitation strategies for fundraising calls and oversee the development of promotional brochures and written material in support of specific fundraising activities;
- coordinate advancement efforts by the Appalachian State University Foundation Board of Directors; and
- assist the Vice Chancellor by promoting sound fundraising practices using metrics for accountability measurements.

KEY COLLEAGUES



Dr. Sheri Everts Chancellor

Dr. Sheri Everts joined Appalachian State University as its eighth leader in July 2014. Previously, she had been Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Illinois State University since 2008.

A Nebraska native who attended elementary school in a one-room schoolhouse, Everts graduated from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in English instruction and secondary education. After teaching middle school and high school English in Kansas and Nebraska, she returned to UNL, where she earned a master's degree in literacy education and

English (1991) and a doctorate in administration, curriculum and instruction (1994).

Everts began her higher education career in 1994 as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Teacher Education at the University of Nebraska Omaha. Rising through the academic and administrative ranks at UNO, she was named Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs in 2000, promoted to Associate Vice President in 2003, and named Interim Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs in 2006. She served in that interim capacity until June 30, 2008, when she left Nebraska to become Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Illinois State University and also served as Interim President at ISU.

Vice Chancellor for University Advancement

Dr. Randy Edwards became Vice Chancellor for University Advancement at Appalachian State University in April 2017 after a national search. Edwards began serving as Interim Vice Chancellor on July 1, 2016. He is responsible for all areas of development, advancement services, and alumni affairs. In addition, he serves as president of the Appalachian State University Foundation.

Edwards became Chancellor Everts' Chief of Staff in July 2014, with Vice Chancellor added to his title in 2015. He was Dean of Appalachian's Walker

College of Business for nine years and Chair of its Department of Accounting for 13 years. He first joined the business faculty in 1981.

Edwards holds a Bachelor of Science and a Master of Science in accounting from Appalachian State University and a Ph.D. from the University of Tennessee. Prior to working in higher education, Edwards was an auditor for Ernst & Ernst, now Ernst & Young.

- demonstrated experience in the identification, cultivation, and solicitation of major gifts, preferably with comprehensive campaign and development experience at an academic institution;
- outstanding written and oral communication skills;
- solid computer user skills: word processing, power point, spreadsheet, database, CRM Software;
- a willingness and ability to travel as required by geographic location of prospects;
- demonstrated knowledge of basic business terminology, financial matters and the ethical, legal, and tax-related issues regarding the solicitation, transfer, and management of charitable gifts;
- an ability to work independently and take initiative, manage competing priorities, coordinate diverse and multiple projects, and meet tight deadlines;
- strong leadership skills; and
- experience with Human Resources issues, personnel and budget management experience.

A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university is required for this position as is a minimum of ten years of senior-level fundraising and high-level administrative experience in higher education or in non-profit organizations, including a successful track record of managing and supervising a team of fundraisers.
