## 32. Imperative Mood

Using the Imperative Mood box from the Master Chart, parse the following Greek imperatives. I have done the first one as an example.

Remember: You can find the person and number and usually the voice by the personal endings. The tense will be either aorist or present.

- Present tense verbs will exhibit no changes from the lexical form.
- Aorist tense verbs will either have a o (first aorist) or a stem change (second aorist). They will not be augmented because the augment indicates past time and outside of the indicative mood, tense has nothing to do with time.
