

EDUM MORGANIANUM

"Burrito" or "Burro's tail" Tolerates some neglect and overwatering. Propagates easily from cuttings and leaves.

Tolerates some neglect. Great for medicinal use. Tall height works well in arrangements.

GRAPTOVERIA 'CALIFORNIA SUNSET'



Thick leaves tolerate long droughts well. Maintains reddish color in lower light. Stays compact.

CRASSULA OVATA



Very common succulent. Tolerates some neglect and overwatering. Does well in low light.

PACHYVERIA GLAUCA



"Little Jewel"
Tolerant of some overwatering. Produces lots of new offsets. Unique color to use in arrangements.

SANSEVIERIA TRIFASCIATA



Requires very little light and water, but tolerates some overwatering. Unique color and shape.

Gorgeous orange color in full sun. Tolerates heat, drought and overwatering. Propagates easily from leaves.

Unusual shaped leaves. Tolerates neglect well. Great "filler" plant for arrangements.

Very tolerant of drought. Propagates easily from plantlets. Great texture for arrangements.
