

The News About Recording PowerPoint or Keynote Slides

- You can record a video in PowerPoint but when you export it as a video the recorded narration is NOT included in the video. (Not sure why they do that!)
- In Keynote, it is very easy to record your slides, export as a video file, and use it online!

Snagit 

- Snagit is a screen capture program created by Tech Smith, the makers of Camtasia. Snagit could be considered the "little sister" of Camtasia.
- Camtasia costs around \$299 while Snagit costs less than \$50.
- The main difference is the editing and effects available.

How to Provide Viewing Access to Your Videos

- You can upload the actual video file directly to Teachable.
- Or... If you want to share your videos outside of Teachable...
- In order to view a video online, you need to upload it to a video hosting sight such as [YouTube](https://www.youtube.com) or [Vimeo.com](https://www.vimeo.com)
 - You can then share the video via the URL or via the embed code. The embed code creates a video player for you.
 - Vimeo gives you more flexibility, however there is a nominal fee.


This is What the YouTube URL & Embed Code Look Like


Add Your Embed Code to Your Blog
