The spot is tiny, has all of about 18 seats, no more than 300 sq ft, always smoky and smells of freshly fried tortilla chips. The food is awesome, I have been going there with my wife for years. NYC is not known for great Mexican, but Itzocan handles the business for traditional Mexican cuisine. They do an AMAZING stuffed chicken breast, the shrimp dish is bananas and their skirt steak rules.
