REPORTING RELATIONSHIPS

The Vice President for Development, Academic Medicine will report to UC Foundation President Peter Landgren. The Vice President's oversight includes six direct reports, the Associate Director of Special Projects; Assistant Vice President of Development, College of Medicine & UC Health; Assistant Vice President of Development, UC Cancer Center; Executive Director of Development, Academic Health Center Colleges; Executive Director of Development, UC Gardner Neuroscience Institute; and Director of Grants, Academic Health Center & UC Health.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Vice President for Development, Academic Medicine will

- lead, plan, implement, and manage fundraising staff and programs for colleges and units within the Academic Health Center and UC Health;
- provide administrative leadership and strategic counsel for assigned fundraising staff and programs;
- partner with UCF President and fellow Vice Presidents who comprise the UC Foundation Lead Team to set and implement strategies that support UC and UC Health;
- lead the development team to set and implement strategies that support UC and UC Health;
- develop the programs and activities required to achieve campaign and fundraising priorities in consultation with the Foundation President, Foundation leadership, Academic Health Center deans, and UC Health leadership;
- recruit, lead, motivate, and manage a team of development professionals working toward the achievement of identified goals and priorities;
- set and attain overall annual fundraising goals for assigned programs;
- establish and manage the operational budget for the Academic Health Center and UC Health working with the Vice President and Chief Financial Officer;
- personally manage a portfolio of major (\$100,000+) and principal (\$1M+) gift prospects and provide ongoing stewardship;
- maintain an active schedule of personal visits with prospects;
- foster productive relationships with faculty and leadership;
- promote and facilitate fundraising projects and joint ventures across public and private sectors;
- advance initiatives to create operational effectiveness to enhance fundraising for academic medicine;
- represent UC, the Foundation, Academic Health Center, and UC Health to alumni, donors, grateful patients, and friends at local and national outreach events; and
- recruit, retain, and support volunteers engaged with assigned fundraising initiatives.

FOUNDATION AND UNIVERSITY LEADERSHIP



Peter Landgren President

Peter Landgren was named President of the University of Cincinnati Foundation and Vice President for Advancement at UC in August 2017 and took office Oct. 2, 2017. In his role, Landgren oversees all philanthropic efforts for the university and UC Health and alumni engagement through the University of Cincinnati Alumni Association.

Landgren, an alumnus of the UC's College-Conservatory of Music (CCM), previously served as Interim Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs

and Provost of the university, as well as Dean of CCM.

Prior to his appointment at CCM in 2011, Landgren served as Conservatory Director at Baldwin-Wallace College from 2007-2011. He had spent the previous 29 years as a musician with the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, 26 years of which he served as a faculty member of the Peabody Conservatory of The Johns Hopkins University (JHU). From 2005-2006, Landgren served JHU's Peabody Institute as the Interim Director.

Landgren's role as UC Foundation President is groundbreaking. His background as a faculty member, dean, and interim provost has uniquely positioned him to understand the role philanthropy can play in elevating a university. And, as a UC alumnus, he brings a distinct passion and connection to UC's values and mission.



Andrew J. Filak, MD Senior Vice President for Health Affairs Christian R. Holmes Professor and Dean of the College of Medicine

Andrew Filak Jr., MD, became the Senior Vice President for Health Affairs and Christian R. Holmes Professor and Dean of the College of Medicine on Jan. 1, 2020. He previously served as Senior Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Founding Chair of the Department of Medical Education, and Professor of Medical Education and Family and Community Medicine at the UC College of Medicine. He also served as Vice President for Education for UC Health.

Dr. Filak is the 53rd Dean since the College of Medicine was founded in 1819. He also is the sixth person – and the first since 1874 – to serve multiple terms as Dean of the college; he was Interim Dean and Vice President for health affairs from Aug. 6, 2010 until June 30, 2011, and Interim Dean and Senior Vice President for Health Affairs from Aug. 2, 2018 until Dec. 31, 2019.

A national leader in medical education, Dr. Filak led all educational activities at the College of Medicine from 1991 until 2018. He also has served as the Designated Institutional Official for graduate medical education for UC Medical Center and the College of Medicine for more than 30 years and as Director of the UC Area Health Education Center program and Director of the Family Medicine Residency Training Program.

Under Dr. Filak's leadership, the College of Medicine revised and implemented an innovative four-year integrative curriculum, which began with the entering class of 2011. With these changes, medical students began receiving hands-on clinical training in a longitudinal primary care course in their first year coupled with early training in in the basics of medical history taking and physical exam skills. Students also receive training as first responders to provide a context for their medical education.

Dr. Filak has also led the efforts during the college's last three Liaison Committee for Medical Education (LCME) accreditation rounds, all resulting in successful eight-year accreditation. He is currently leading the college's preparation for the next LCME accreditation, scheduled for fall 2019.

Raised in Jersey City, New Jersey, Dr. Filak attended Saint Peters College. He received his medical degree from George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences in Washington, D.C. He came to the UC College of Medicine in 1978 for his family medicine residency and served as Chief Resident in that program. He joined the UC faculty in 1981.

Dr. Filak has received numerous awards during his career, most recently receiving the UC College of Medicine's highest honor, the Daniel Drake Medal, in May 2018. Other honors include the John. C. Leonard Award from the Association for Hospital Medical Education (2016), University of Cincinnati Award for Excellence (2012), the Parker J. Palmer Courage to Lead Award from the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (2009) and Educator of the Year from the Ohio Academy of Family Physicians (2003). He also has served in leadership roles of prominent medical education organizations, including the Association for Hospital Medical Education, the Education Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates, Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, American Association of Medical Colleges, the Ohio Academy of Family Physician, the Southwest Society of Family Physicians, and the National Board of Medical Examiners.



Richard P. Lofgren, MD, MPH, FACP President and CEO, UC Health

Richard P. Lofgran, MD, MPH, FACP, is President and CEO of UC Health, the University of Cincinnati's affiliated health system. UC Health, with more than 11,000 employees, physicians, and advanced practice providers, comprises University of Cincinnati Medical Center, West Chester Hospital, Daniel Drake Center for Post-Acute Care, Lindner Center of HOPE, and more than 30 outpatient service locations in three states.

Dr. Lofgren is a board-certified internal medicine physician and administrator with nearly 40 years of experience in healthcare with a particular interest in healthcare delivery redesign, operational efficiencies, performance improvement, and applied health services/quality research.

Dr. Lofgren previously served as Senior Vice President and Chief Clinical

Officer for University Health System Consortium (UHC), now Vizient, and was responsible for helping UHC members improve the quality, safety, efficiency, and effectiveness of their clinical services. Prior to UHC, Lofgren spent eight years at UK HealthCare, the University of Kentucky's academic health system, joining as Chief Medical Officer in 2004 and later becoming Vice President for Healthcare Operations and Chief Clinical Officer.

Before joining UK HealthCare, Dr. Lofgren held various faculty and administrative posts throughout the Midwest, including the Medical College of Wisconsin, the University of Pittsburgh (and the Pittsburgh VA Medical Center), the University of Minnesota (and the Minneapolis VA Medical Center), and Michigan State University.

Dr. Lofgren received his undergraduate and medical degrees from the University of Michigan, completed his residency and chief residency at the University of Minnesota, and received a master of public health from the University of Minnesota School of Public Health.

He serves on the Vizient Board of Managers, the Ohio Hospital Association board, and the boards of the Association of American Medical Colleges' Council of Teaching Hospitals and Health Systems (COTH), Greater Cincinnati Urban League, and the Cincinnati USA Regional Chamber.



Steve Rosfeld Vice President for Development

Stephen A. Rosfeld is Vice President for Development at the University of Cincinnati Foundation. In this role, he leads the major gift fundraising efforts of nine main campus colleges and units, athletics, corporate engagement, foundation relations, and the central development team (national development and gift planning) at the UC Foundation. He also carries strategic leadership responsibilities for the comprehensive *Next*, *Now* campaign.

As a student at the University of Cincinnati, Rosfeld was an intern for the UC Foundation and ultimately joined the organization in 2006 as an alumni relations professional for the UC Alumni Association. He has assumed additional responsibilities over the years including previously serving as the Executive Director of Development for the Carl H. Lindner College of Business. A proud graduate of the University of Cincinnati, Rosfeld previously served in a variety of capacities for several local and national political campaigns. He is an active member of the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) and the Association for Fundraising Professionals (AFP)
