Message from the President and General Manager

Welcome to the 2011 Annual Report, as we move into a new financial year it is timely to reflect upon the projects which have been undertaken and our achievements over the past 12 months.

At the forefront of this report we take the opportunity to thank the Squash SA Board and Advisory Committee Members for their commendable voluntary work over the past 12 months.

The Board remains committed to ensure the Association will be better positioned than ever before to safeguard the longevity of the sport. Changes to our organisational structure and a new approach to strategy and operations will lead to a new era for Squash in South Australia.

Accordingly, the 2010/2011 budget was prepared with a particular focus on increasing capacity and setting performance targets to evaluate the return on this investment. Significant milestones over the past 12 months include: improvement of facilities, game and player development, increasing participation, governance and administration.

Improvement of Facilities

Squash SA formed a long term partnership with The Barossa Council which has seen six ASB squash courts incorporated into a \$15.5M Regional Sporting Hub – The Rex Aquatic and Fitness Centre. The Board committed \$250,000 funding to the promotion of Squash in the Barossa Region. The new courts are within walking distance of schools, and will service a rapidly growing commuter and rural population. The investment will drive a resurgence of squash in the Barossa and directly meets the Associations objective to strategically invest in school and council-owned facilities.

Applications for Squash SA's Facilities Enhancement Grant funding program were received from across the state as venue owners and operators were able to take advantage of a new funding opportunity and make improvements to their Centres. In 2010/2011 the Board allocated \$45,000 funding to FEG projects. The dollar for dollar funding program has stimulated approximately \$90,000 value in squash centre improvements and upgrades.

The redevelopment of the Racquets SA car park has increased car parking to 70 spaces, improving the access, safety and aesthetical elements of the area.

Game and Player Development

A new Performance Pathways Model was introduced, with a clear focus on developing grass roots and better supporting our top junior players. SA boasts several junior boys and girls nationally ranked in the top 16 of their age groups. A Professional Coaching Pool has been established to assist the juniors progression to national junior rankings and senior competition.

Squash SA also established the Talented Athlete Funding Program to support Elite players to train in Adelaide and to travel overseas as part of the International Circuit.

In a glittering ceremony held at the Adelaide Convention Centre on Saturday 20 November 2010, SA and Australian squash great Vicki Cardwell was one of the first 20 South Australian sporting luminaries to be inducted into the SA Sports Hall of Fame. Vicki joined the likes of Sir Donald Bradman (Cricket), Lisa Ondieki (Athletics), Gillian Rolton (Equestrian), Phil Smyth (Basketball), and many other household names. Congratulations Vicki.

Increasing Participation

Development Staff were assigned to zones - Central, Northern, Southern and Country with a key focus on growing grass roots participation. Their good work has resulted in steady participation growth at a junior club level and growth in junior tournament attendance. In addition the number of Pennant Player registrations has been maintained, for the first time in several years.

Introduced in 2011, the 'Get Moving Play Squash, Squash Week' marketing campaign had a contemporary edge and targeted our next generation of players. The campaign, which culminated in the Squash Gala Night, and Chateau Tanunda SA Open, sparked renewed enthusiasm and excitement in squash and racquetball.

Governance

On behalf of the Board, we wish to acknowledge the contribution of the whole team, including Racquets SA and Squash SA Staff, our committees, sponsors, club coaches, administrators, referees and volunteers. The entire team is very passionate and dedicated to the overall development of squash and racquetball in South Australia.



- Referees Association will continue to work with Squash SA to deliver high quality refereeing at Junior Tournaments.

COACHING



Member Services Report

- In 2010 Squash SA piloted a formal affiliation process which introduced 7 compliance components. 13 clubs/centres returned forms.
- In 2011, affiliation increased to 31 clubs/centres/schools completing affiliation forms and agreeing to the compliance components.
- Affiliation year changed from financial year to calendar year to align with Squash Australia's Public Liability Insurance Program
- 9 new Affiliated Centres including 2 council centres, 1 x YMCA and 1 x school.
- Facility Enhancement Grant information booklet and policy released to Affiliation Members.
- Introduction of Affiliated Member branding to all Affiliated Centres.
- Introduction of online event entry software.
- The release of Squash SA "strengthen, sustain, succeed" promotional brochure supporting a new era and the 2010-2013 Strategic Plan.
- Squash SA moved to new premises at 440 Goodwood Road, Cumberland Park. New premises provide members and committees with a meeting room and access to IT. Street frontage exposure.

Country Coordination Report

On 1 March 2011, Grant Norman was appointed to the newly created position of Country Coordinator.

During the past 4 months, the following has been achieved:

- A comprehensive database of all things country has been compiled.
- Regular correspondence with all clubs has commenced.
- The number of affiliated clubs has increased from 7 to 10 clubs.
- The number of clubs utilising the Matrix has increased from 1 to 5 clubs.
- The number of players registered with Squash SA has increased from 100 to 300 players.

The plan for the next 12 months is to:

- Increase the number of affiliated clubs from 10 to 12 clubs.
- Increase the number of clubs utilising the Matrix from 5 to 9 clubs.
- Increase the number of players registered with SA from 300 to 450 players.
- Increase the number of accredited country coaches from 3 to 6 coaches.
- Increase the number of junior development programs from 3 to 5 programs.
- Support the hosting of 4 junior tournaments compared to 1 last year.

The activities of the Committee during the past 12 months included:

- Introducing a State Junior Ranking policy.
- Reviewing 4 Squash SA policies relating to juniors and recommending changes.
- Discontinuing the SA Juniors matrix and incorporating all junior results into the SA matrix and then introducing a separate juniors listing within the SA matrix.
- Providing the Board, Pathways Manager and Development Officers with advice, support and recommendations in relation to the:
 - Performance Pathway Model.
 - Junior tournament calendar and procedures.
 - State Junior Team.
 - State Junior Rankings.
 - Australian Junior Championships.
 - National Junior Series.

The plan for the next 12 months is to continue to provide a sounding board for the Squash SA staff in all matters relating to junior squash.

Marketing Advisory Committee

Report

The Marketing Advisory Committee was formed in 2010 with 4 members, and met on 6 occasions. The Marketing Committee's focus during 2010/11 has been on marketing squash and racquetball as modern, exciting and energetic sports – for all levels of participation from beginners through to professional athletes. With support from Squash SA staff, relationships with complementary industry bodies, media and squash facility owners have been enhanced, resulting in increased support and sponsorships. New branding for squash, racquetball and Racquets SA reflect this new approach.

Squash Week provided a highly successful 'launch' for a more active and targeted marketing strategy. It aimed to connect with the community at a variety of levels, and corporate and media partnerships supported new communication strategies. Significant new media coverage included drive time promotion on Triple M with Chris Dittmar and Andrew Jarman, specific publicity on more than 14 squash-focused web sites, and live-time updates on the Squash SA web page.

Locally, a club sponsorship strategy saw 24,000 promotional brochures distributed in affiliated club's local areas. This was supported by the 'Get Moving, Play Squash' banners strategically placed around Adelaide. The impact will be monitored to improve and refine our strategies for local promotion. Activities in Rundle Mall with the inflatable courts drew a great deal of attention with school kids participation and hand-outs of promotional materials along with Wii and TV coverage.

Pennant Committee Report

First and foremost, the Pennant Committee would like to thank Alissa Proctor for her service to the Pennant Committee. Alissa took on the role while also working on the Board and other Committees, yet even at her busiest always provided valuable insight and a very level-headed approach to decision making. Her presence on the Committee will be missed.

We would also like to give our utmost thanks to Tanya Virgens. Tanya's role is a very difficult one and the Committee's job is made infinitely easier by her tireless work ethic, her understanding of the by-laws and her ability to succinctly summarise issues for the Committee. Without such excellent assistance, it would be a very difficult job indeed, and we look forward to continuing this positive working relationship into the future.

Over the last year, the Pennant Committee has been satisfied with the number of teams in the Pennant Competition remaining steady at around 100. Most pleasing to the Committee has been the establishment of 'entry level' Division 4 competitions on both Monday and Tuesday nights, with brand new teams able to come in from a social background and be competitive within those Grades.

Challenges

The Committee remains concerned by the lack of new, younger players coming into the Pennant competition, as we understand the importance of renewal given our aging player base, but we have tremendous faith in the ability of the Development Officers to bring new players into the game.

Strategies to Address Challenges

The Committee was very pleased to establish a Northern Division 3 on Wednesdays this season. A long term goal is to be able to split all Divisions by location, ideally North, Central and South, as most feedback received from players is that away games at opposite ends of the city are not preferred.

The Committee hopes to seek out ways to revitalize and rejuvenate the Women's game, as numbers have fallen in recent years. We will work together with the Women's Committee as we seek to increase numbers and improve the current structure.

The Committee was very pleased to see a much more competitive Premier League competition in the 2011 Autumn Pennant. Restrictions on team composition – barring persons with a matrix below 210 from playing – may seem harsh at first glance, but the most competitive season in a number of years is an early indication of such measures being successful. We will continue to review the Premier League competition as we seek to make it an important long-term goal for budding new Squash players.

A final word – the Pennant Committee is always after feedback. Almost all of the actions we take have a genesis in a suggestion made, either formally or informally, by a player or players, to a member of the Committee. While our major role is to run the competition and enforce the by-laws, we have a duty to look after every individual who elects to play Pennant. If you have any thoughts, feedback or criticisms, contact Squash SA, who will in turn contact us. The more we hear from players, the better educated our actions are.

Racquetball Report

The highlight for the year was confirmation that South Australia had been chosen to host the 2013 and 2014 Australian Racquetball Championships.

Expected to attract over 100 players, this will be the largest racquetball tournament held outside of Victoria and will be held at the new \$15.5m redeveloped centre at the Barossa Valley, The Rex. With over \$7,000 in prize money and trophies the event attracts the best racquetball and squash players from around the country with Cameron White and Sarah Fitzgerald winning it in 2011.

Another pleasing note was the number of new people playing the sport this year. While pennant numbers have remained fairly stable, we have seen 10-20 new players in the Thursday morning competition at Norwood, and the Wednesday night competition run at Karadinga.

Last year saw the introduction of the inaugural National Racquetball Circuit, a joint initiative between SA, Victoria and Tasmania to help promote interstate participation at the state tournaments. It has already proved successful with an increase in the number of Victorian, NSW and even Queensland players in our State Championships in March and many of our players competed in tournaments in Victoria.

We also hope to see many interstate players participating in the 2011 Australian Masters Games in Adelaide, during 15th and 16th of October.

With the support of Squash SA, we hope the new facility in the Barossa will assist in us growing the game of racquetball in the area, and we will continue to focus on introducing racquetball to younger players as part of our schools programs.

Challenges

2010/11 proved to be a challenging year for Racquets SA. Both the economic climate and increased pressure for tighter Federal regulation of the gaming industry created broad uncertainty throughout the Hospitality industry. However, allowing for the fact that the net return percentage for Gaming was unexpectedly low, the Club reached its budget targets.

Strategies to Address Challenges

The focus for the future of Racquets SA remains firmly on capacity building to fully utilise the facilities. To this end, the major achievement for the past year was the completion of our new 70 space, off-street car park.

Racquets SA remain committed to improving the services and facilities offered to our members, and in accordance, a staged refurbishment to the interior of the venue is in planning to include:

- Tub chairs and coffee tables to complement the gaming room and function bar.
- Upgrade of bistro furniture and general decor.
- Replacement of bar counter top.
- Sports bar furnishings.
- Re-use of meeting room.



Finance and Risk Advisory Committee Report

Since 2002 pennant numbers have been declining at an average rate of 76 players per year. This is clearly not a sustainable position for the sport and so 12 months ago the Board embarked on a 3 year strategy whereby it has increased staffing capacity and provided additional resources with the objective of turning the sport around.

The decision to engage new Staff and Development Officers was not taken lightly and for the 2011 financial year the net cost amounted to \$160,000.

The results of this 'investment' speak volumes as 1 year into the program we have seen the historical erosion of 76 pennant players per year stop. The key challenge for the Development Officers, Board, and Committees is to ensure that all efforts are made to increase player participation.



Challenges

Key to the Development Officers responsibilities is to increase junior participation in Squash SA events which has seen a marked increase over the past 12 months. This will be key to the long term sustainability of the sport.

Financial Challenges Include


- To address the risk of poker machine reforms eroding profits the Finance Committee are actively looking to diversify Squash SA's revenue streams.
- The glass court is currently not being used and is incurring approximately \$4,000/year insurance costs. We are actively looking to dispose of this court and there is a strong risk that we will not realise the recorded value of \$75,000.

- Restrictions on Government funding due to the poker machine income.
- Increased staff numbers meant that we needed to move out of South Adelaide thereby incurring rent.

Strategies to Address Challenges

To enable Squash SA to afford Development Officers and related expenses, key strategies have been put in place to:

- Ensure cost controls are in place and only essential value add spend is being incurred.
- Stretch targets are in place for all areas of Squash SA and Racquets SA.

- Established a strong Finance Committee with diverse experience and credentials.
- Successfully funded the car park.
- Funding is in place for The Rex at the Barossa Valley.

Finance Report

Racquets SA experienced a further downturn in Gaming Surplus of \$57,000. This trend (down \$140,000 the previous year) is of concern and with the current economic situation is likely to continue. With the demolition of the Brookman and Paul Street properties, there was a reduction of \$14,000 in Net Property Income. Other Sundry Income increased by \$11,000. Administrative Expenses increased by \$56,000 due mainly to Rates and Taxes (\$25,000) and Borrowing Costs (\$29,000) associated with the new car park. The Association is now incurring Payroll Tax (\$13,500) due to our increased payroll.

The Net Racquets SA Operating Profit dropped from \$724,000 to \$620,000 down \$104,000. Contributions to Squash SA increased by \$330,000 to \$750,000.


Squash Administration Expenses increased by \$66,000 due mainly to Wages (\$27,000), Meeting Expenses (\$6,000) and Rent (\$10,000).

Additional expenses were incurred in Marketing (\$57,000), Member Services (\$87,000), Metro and Regional Development (\$123,000) as well as the Pathways Portfolio (\$36,000). Other Activities reduced by \$14,000 due mainly to the absence of an Australian Open.

Net Squash Costs increased from \$375,000 to \$738,000 – up \$363,000.

Unfortunately this has resulted in a reduction in Members Equity (down \$227,000) which includes the reevaluation of the Glass Court down by \$141,685 to \$75,000.
