The Director of Foundation Relations will ensure financial support of the organization by developing and implementing a strategic fundraising plan and executing strategies to identify, cultivate, and solicit relationships in a manner that will increase revenue for Mercy For Animals. The Director of Foundation Relations will secure grants annually and work with philanthropy officers and other team members to set goals, priorities, and direction for the foundation program.

Mercy for Animals is on the front lines—fighting to protect farmed animals. Working in factory farms, corporate boardrooms, and courts of justice, it is speaking up to end cruelty and inspire compassion. Mercy for Animals has three core approaches to achieving its mission. The first is to make alternatives to animal-based meat, eggs, and dairy as attractive and accessible as possible. Mercy for Animals also works to make animal products less competitive and less attractive to consumers, food producers, and policymakers. Finally, Mercy for Animals works to reduce the suffering for animals in the current food system.

Since its first investigation over 20 years ago, Mercy for Animals has made a huge impact for animals through campaigns, storytelling, and the mobilization of thousands of advocates. Through holding governments accountable and pushing for change in laws, Mercy for Animals has saved more than 300,000 animals from the food system in the past three years alone.

Over the next three years, Mercy for Animals plans to expand its work and make greater headway towards its mission of ending industrial animal agriculture and constructing a just and sustainable global food system. The plans include decreasing the number of animals in the food system and reducing the suffering for farmed animals that are trapped in the food system. Mercy For Animals also aims to build people power and increase public awareness of the atrocities of farmed animals to drive change including developing solutions to speed the transition away from industrial animal agriculture.

- conduct research to identify foundation prospects, for both the organization as a whole and for specific programs and projects that align with Mercy for Animals' strategic direction;
- develop and execute individualized strategies for long-term foundation funding growth for foundation prospects and donors and persuasively articulate needs to foundations;
- identify, solicit, and cultivate relationships with foundation prospects and donors;
- maintain focus and a high level of individual activity, including writing letters of inquiry and submitting grant proposals;
- lead all aspects of creating and submitting foundation grant proposals and reports, including writing, preparation of supporting documentation, and collection of required attachments;
- develop a strong working relationship with colleagues and partners to identify, develop, and frame aspects of existing programs and plans that have the potential to attract grant funding; and
- produce reports on activities and progress toward goals.

- experience writing proposals, securing gift commitments, and developing relationships with foundations;
- experience preparing timely, accurate, and comprehensive written reports and presentations;
- experience identifying funding prospects utilizing Foundation Directory and other sources;
- outstanding interpersonal skills and an ability to collaborate effectively;
- superior analytical, project-management, and communication skills, both written and oral;
- an ability to effectively articulate clear and compelling messages and stories;
- strong organizational and time-management skills, with the self-motivation and discipline needed to regularly set and achieve work goals with minimal supervision;
- exceptional attention to detail and excellent planning, tracking, and follow-up skills;
- an ability to multitask in a fast-paced environment with changing priorities and limited resources; and
- a commitment to continued personal and organizational growth in diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice principles.

A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience is required for this position as is at least five years of progressively responsible experience in a successful foundation relations program.

This is a remote position that may be performed from any location in the United States.
