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
Mind mapping

- The outline or skeleton of your story
- Where you want to go in your story
- Write down some ideas before you start writing your story

- Meeting a hero or celebrity
- A crime

> Describes the situation

>Creates the atmosphere

> Describes any characters

The Middle

Something important or dramatic

> The most important part of the story

The End

> How you managed the dramatic or significant event

> What was its consequence

> How were characters changed by the dramatic or significant event

Writing Tips for Structure

> Write clearly


> Use paragraphs

> Short stories usually have at least three paragraphs

Use linking words. Also called "discourse markers" for example, However, At the beginning, In the end, Finally, Moreover.
