


Historical Mapping of Yangzhou

Description: The mapping is about the historical infrastructures of Yangzhou City from Jin Dynasty (317-420 A.D.) to Qing Dynasty (1636-1912 A.D.), which have already disappeared today, including the city walls, old temples, official institutes, canals and Yangtze Rivers riverbanks, in order to study the evolution of man-made urban contexts according to non-human natural landscapes, and relationship between water system and city's central public spaces.
