The Vice President of Development will lead all fundraising activities within Retro Report's small but growing nonprofit newsroom. The Vice President will research, cultivate, solicit, and steward major, principal, and institutional donors within annual and long-range fundraising programs including special events, and periodic campaigns, such as the current campaign to raise funds for *Retro Report on PBS*. Working closely with the Co-founder and President and Board of Directors, the Vice President will assist in the identification of new Directors to strengthen overall support and leadership at the Board level. Consistent with the mission of Retro Report, the Vice President will be a superior communicator—with the ability to convey the public service mission of Retro Report to the public in a concise and compelling manner.

Retro Report has produced more than 150 documentaries and video series and has partnered with *The New York Times, The New Yorker, PBS, NBC, Politico, the Guardian, Univision, Quartz,* and others to reach a growing audience. These documentaries provide meaningful context to today's headlines in a new and exciting way.

Retro Report operates with the conviction that an engaging and forward-looking review of high-profile events, and the news coverage surrounding them, is critical to understanding the lessons of history and developing robust civic literacy. And, since the stories it reports on continue to evolve, it is committed to providing a permanent, living library where each story is tracked and updated so that viewers can gain new insights as events develop and history unfolds.

Retro Report strives to counter the confusion that has been created by a frenzied media landscape by presenting the deep historical context needed to understand the issues that impact our lives. That perspective better serves the public and is often missing in commercial journalism today. Through fresh investigative reporting and compelling storytelling, Retro Report offers new insights into events that are all too often reported today but forgotten tomorrow.

PRINCIPAL OPPORTUNITIES

It's easy to look at news onscreen or online and despair that media is getting faster and dumber. Audiences are changing, platforms are transforming, and, for journalists, it often feels like the space for good work is shrinking. But there's one undeniable aspect of the moment we're living through that's not smaller, not less than what's come before. The potential size of the audience for stories of any kind has grown larger than it's ever been, maybe in the history of the world. A video that goes viral online can reach a billion people. And right now, videos that blow up in a huge way rarely feature intelligent takes on the news. But some journalists are working to change that.

Just as high-minded offerings like "60 Minutes" rose from the wasteland of game shows and sitcoms in the 1960s, new forms of factual video storytelling are taking shape online. Retro Report isn't the only outlet trying to invent this new form. But we have a uniquely focused mission, using history to explain the present, which sets us apart. The best traditional news outlets are great at gathering a variety of perspectives on the biggest issues of the day, but they often lack the time to show how precedents, hidden repercussions, and misunderstood moments from the past shape what's happening now. And for Retro Report, lessons of history inform the very core of how we work. Whether you're talking about moveable type, or telegraph wires or Google searches, no technology in the history of media has changed the fact that journalists need time and resources to find the truth and explain it clearly. Retro Report recognizes this fact and gives its journalists the weeks and sometimes months it takes to track sources down, double-check our facts, and show how forgotten or misunderstood moments from the past can illuminate today.

Being on a team with these advantages is a rare thing. The mission isn't about getting ratings or retweets or likes. It's about doing the best possible work that has the most possible impact. So, if you're upset about the state of news, you've come to right place. We're figuring out how to do it better.

The Vice President of Development will

- organize and manage a fully operational Development Office;
- create and lead fundraising programs for major and principal gift support;
- plan and execute effective fundraising approaches to individuals, foundations, and corporations;
- build and maintain a donor base capable of sustaining Retro Report's growth;
- cultivate relationships to broaden public awareness and recognition of Retro Report;
- build a large sustained base of annual donors;
- manage the development staff, including a Grants Writer and Grants Administrative Assistant;
- oversee the donor management systems, working with the Grants Administrative Assistant to
 ensure donor data is accurate, requests and proposals are tracked, reports are submitted on a
 timely basis, and communications for all fundraising activities are successful;
- plan and conduct fundraising special events;
- identify and cultivate new Board members;
- lead or assist with the drafting and review of grant proposals; and
- lead or assist with the creation of marketing materials.
