

Session 10: Seeking Out Mentors and Mentoring Fellow Christians

Consider how Christians can mentor each other. Read Acts 14:21-28, Acts 19:1-10, and Acts 28:30-31.

Questions to spark discussion based on reading of Acts:

- 1. What did mentoring in the early Christian community involve?
- 2. What topics were covered during times together?
- 3. How did mentoring help individual Christians?
- 4. How did mentoring benefit the entire community?

Questions to spark discussion based on Acts and personal experiences:

- 1. Have you ever mentored someone else or been mentored?
- 2. Describe experiences as a mentor and/or mentee.
- 3. Have you ever coached someone or given advice to others to help them improve? Was this advice well-received or rejected?
- 4. Did you grow from these experiences? Did your mentor/mentee grow? Why or why not?
- 5. What elements make a positive, nurturing mentoring experience?

Purpose: Develop an understanding of how early Christian leaders dedicated themselves to mentoring other Christians.

Desired Outcome: Seek out Christians from whom to learn. Be willing to share stories and offer insights to other Christians.

Big Idea: Mentoring can strengthen the Christian community.
