The Director of Advancement will provide clear vision, leadership, management, and comprehensive strategic direction for all aspects of Brooklyn Friends School's advancement program. This includes both short-term and long-term strategies for Annual Giving, the Alumni Program, Endowment, Capital Campaigns, community engagement, and strategic communications.

Brooklyn Friends School is a preschool through 12th grade independent Quaker school located in the thriving downtown Brooklyn neighborhood. Most of the faculty at the college-preparatory school hold advanced degrees, and the Upper School offers the academically challenging and highly esteemed International Baccalaureate Diploma Program—one of only three independent New York City schools to do so. The school is proud of its active, supportive parent body, its enthusiastic teachers and dedicated staff, and its thoughtful and articulate students.

Founded in 1867 by the Religious Society of Friends as a co-educational grade school, Brooklyn Friends School had an initial student body of 17 studying in the landmarked Brooklyn Monthly Meetinghouse at 110 Schermerhorn Street. The school expanded to include a kindergarten in 1902 and a high school division in 1907. In the early 1970s, the school moved to larger, more-spacious quarters at 375 Pearl Street. The seven-story building dates to 1928 and previously housed the Brooklyn Law School. Today, 700 students ranging in age from 2 to 18 attend one of the four academic levels—Preschool, Lower School, Middle School, and Upper School. Brooklyn Friends School nurtures a lifelong love of learning and fosters strength of character, values, and the ability to think expansively in all students.

Brooklyn Friends School integrates a rich learning environment with a compelling history of value-driven education and a dedicated and diverse community. The Quaker values of simplicity, peace, integrity, community, equality, and stewardship are the underpinnings of the school's academic strength. They inform Brooklyn Friends' faithful commitment to academic excellence and opportunity as well as the warmth and respect students, parents, and staff impart and experience within the school. From an indepth study of the solar system in Preschool to participation in the prestigious International Baccalaureate Program in Upper School, study at Brooklyn Friends School provides students with the academic preparation sought by the most competitive colleges and universities.

The Brooklyn Friends School Performing Arts and Visual Arts Programs provide a dynamic and globally influenced, inclusive arts education that emphasize active participation, collaboration, and the illumination of its Quaker values. The school weaves a profound and integrated tapestry of a Quaker values driven, exceptional education, cultivating confident global citizens who let their lives speak in the spirit of leadership and service. Brooklyn Friends also cultivates an athletic community grounded in teamwork, leadership development, and ethical conduct, fortified by the values of engagement, camaraderie, and excellence, embodying dedication to sportsperson-ship and the holistic wellbeing of each student.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

Leadership and Management

The Director of Advancement will

- build and grow a multi-year strategic advancement program that strengthens the school's outreach and community engagement activities, while aligning with the school's strategic goals, mission, and core values;
- develop and maintain relationships with key stakeholders of the school, including families, colleagues, alumni, parents of alumni, grandparents, and friends;
- build and sustain an effective strategic partnership with the Board of Trustees and Head of School in order to assure that advancement goals are carefully integrated within the school's overall strategic goals and provide consistent and effective preparation and support for the Trustees;
- identify and cultivate relationships with high-capacity potential donors;
- serve as staff liaison for the Advancement Committee of the Board of Trustees, and provide input
 and data to the Board of Trustees as needed, including input to the Nominating and Governance
 committee for staffing Board committees and potential Trustees;
- participate as a member of the Senior Leadership Team of the school and, in this capacity, perform duties as assigned by the Head of School; and
- in coordination with the Director of Communications and Marketing, collaborate to ensure consistent messaging throughout all aspects of school life.

Development

The Director of Advancement will

- oversee the creation and implementation of a comprehensive fundraising plan that furthers the philanthropic culture of the Brooklyn Friends School community;
- develop, cultivate, and steward a strategic advancement plan for the long-term philanthropic growth and stability of Brooklyn Friends School;
- provide leadership and strategic direction for future capital campaigns;
- identify, cultivate, and solicit a portfolio of top major and planned gift prospects, making solicitations directly or facilitating with the Head of School or Trustees;
- cultivate relationships with key stakeholders while overseeing all aspects of Brooklyn Friends School's fundraising programs for these constituents;

- identify partnerships with major foundations and trusts that support key school initiatives centered on reciprocal mission-aligned commitments;
- build and execute programming that educates community members about how philanthropy supports the mission and goals of Brooklyn Friends School;
- develop and implement strategies for cultivating relationships leading to solicitation, while continuing to cultivate and steward major individual donors;
- ensure that donors feel their support of Brooklyn Friends School is a personally fulfilling experience and demonstrate the impact of their contributions in timely and meaningful ways; and
- manage volunteer involvement in the school's advancement efforts while setting and maintaining high-quality standards for the involvement and stewardship of volunteers in the development program.

Alumni Engagement

The Director of Advancement will

- oversee the creation and implementation of a robust alumni engagement program that builds a community of invested alumni who are actively engaged with and philanthropic towards Brooklyn Friends School;
- oversee alumni outreach, programs, and fundraising efforts to ensure that relationships with alumni are established, maintained, and enhanced;
- oversee the design and execution of alumni programming to engage with alumni, alumni colleagues, and alumni families to include trips, alumni gatherings, and other special events;
- while stewarding existing alumni relationships, identify and engage new alumni to increase involvement with the school;
- cultivate and build alumni volunteer opportunities throughout the school community;
- work with the Director of College Counseling and other members of the Upper School leadership team to effectively build an engaged young alumni community beginning with the Upper School student relationship; and
- collaborate with other leadership team members throughout the school to identify engagement opportunities for alumni, including but not limited to, athletic events and guest speakers.

Community Engagement

The Director of Advancement will

- through collaboration and partnership with other school leaders, build and cultivate relationships with key stakeholders of Brooklyn Friends School to further their invested commitment in the life of the school community;
- in partnership with the Assistant Director of Communications and Community Engagement, identify opportunities for programming with key stakeholders to ensure all community members are connected to the school;
- in partnership with the Director of Enrollment, identify opportunities in which members of the community can support enrollment and retention efforts of the school;
- work with the Director of Diversity, Equity, and Belonging on opportunities for points of learning and community engagement events for families; and
- work with the Academic Leadership team to identify opportunities for collaboration for furthering engagement with families.

LEADERSHIP

Crissy Cáceres Head of School

Crissy Cáceres, a 27-year veteran in independent education, is in her fifth year as the proud head of Brooklyn Friends School. Currently, she serves as a Trustee for the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) Board. She also sits on the Board of the New York State Association of Independent Schools (NYSAIS), Leadership + Design, and the Caedmon School and is a commissioner on the New York State Association Commission on Accreditation. She was a long-time member of Call to Action, an NAIS think-tank devoted to social justice efforts nationwide, and she is currently on her 17th year as a faculty member at the NAIS Diversity Leadership Institute.

Prior to joining the Brooklyn Friends School community, Crissy served in several leadership positions within the independent school landscape. She was the Assistant Head of School for Equity and Social Impact at Georgetown Day School (D.C.), and before that she served as Head of Lower School at Abington Friends School (PA). She also held the Assistant Head of Lower School position at Episcopal Academy (PA) where she began her independent school teaching career. Crissy is committed to utilizing her voice within collaborative settings centered on creating socially just and healthy experiences for schools.

Crissy has served as a Middle States Accreditation Commissioner, co-chaired the People of Color Conference in Philadelphia, served on various leadership associations, and has partnered with schools and organizations nation-wide as a consultant, presenter, and facilitator on various topics. Some topics include Conflict and Change Management, Governance, and Strategic Frameworks. A graduate of Wellesley College, Crissy then earned her master's degree in educational policy and leadership from the University of Pennsylvania. At her core, she embraces the values of a love-based, joyful, and inclusive education for all.

- excellent leadership abilities including interpersonal and collaborative skills, speaking and writing skills, strong listening skills, organizational skills, and an ability to follow through;
- a credible, engaging, and inspiring approach to communication and an ability to genuinely infuse core human values and a social justice-driven framework in one's work;
- a commitment to continued learning and upholding the school's values within one's lived personal and professional experiences;

- comfort with and a desire to learn more about Quaker values and decision-making practices;
- experience working within and influencing the growth of a high performing team;
- an ability to present governance level data and fundraising-relevant facts to the Board of Trustees;
- knowledge of research, data acquisition and analysis, and successful implementation of strategies currently shaping effective and emboldened fundraising efforts in PreK-12, colleges and universities, non-profits, and other entities;
- adept and efficient decision-making skills and an ability to seek broad input with transparency and collaboration;
- program development and development project management experience from conception to delivery of ideas; and
- an ability to work independently as well as collaboratively, flexibly, and thoughtfully in a fast-paced and ambitious environment.

A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience and at least eight years of experience building and growing multi-year strategic advancement programs in an independent school or higher education environment is preferred. Brooklyn Friends School will consider candidates with a broad range of backgrounds.
