Casual User / Requires One-off Simple Edits

MS Paint (Windows)



- **Pros:**

- Included free with Windows PC
- Straightforward for simple edits (rotate, resize, basic text)

- **Cons:**

- Transparency not supported
- Difficult to combine images or collage

Photos (Mac)



- **Pros:**

- Included free with Mac computer
- Straightforward for simple edits (rotate, resize, basic text)

- **Cons:**

- Really is meant for photo editing
- Limited edits

Paint.net (Windows)



- **Pros:**

- Free download for Windows users
- Supports layered editing
- Easier interface to grasp than GIMP, PaintShop Pro & Photoshop

- **Cons:**

- Not as robust as other image editing applications
- Layered files are their own type (.pdn)

Beginners & Creatives Looking for Features

PicMonkey



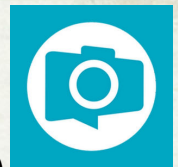
- **Cost:** free trial; subscription ~\$6 to ~\$9/mo
- **Features:**
 - Web-based editing tool
 - Straightforward for simple edits (rotate, resize, basic text)
 - Supports layers & transparency
 - Lots of built in templates, effects, filters & themes
- **Notes:** layers supported only when saving to cloud ("Hub"), Hub storage limits by plan, combining images & creating collages not as straightforward

GIMP



- **Cost:** free download
- **Features:**
 - Open source software
 - Supports layers & transparency
 - Similar interface to Photoshop Elements
 - Free floating toolbars
 - Supports brushes
- **Notes:** layer effects, filters etc. limited & need to install add-ins to enhance functionality, limited support for multi-layer Photoshop .psd files, similar learning curve to Photoshop

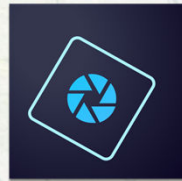
Corel PaintShop Pro



- **Cost:** ~\$80 (one-time)
- **Features:**
 - Supports layers & transparency
 - Lots of effects & filters
 - Supports brushes
- **Notes:** requires Windows computer, download or CD version, similar learning curve to Photoshop, less control over effects, selections and text edits than Photoshop

What's the Difference?

Photoshop Elements (PSE)



- **Users:** creatives, digital artists & photographers
- **Features:**
 - Raster image & photo editing
 - Supports layers & brushes
 - Image correction, text, masking, adjustments, etc.
 - “Light” version of Photoshop
- **Cost:** ~\$99 (one-time fee)
- **Method:** download or CD to computer
- **Learning Curve:** great for beginners; requires instruction to get started
- **Notes:** update version regularly




Photoshop CC




- **Users:** creatives, digital artists & photographers, artistic professionals
- **Features:**
 - Raster image & photo editing
 - Supports layers & brushes
 - Image correction, text, masking, adjustments, etc.
 - Less intuitive/user-friendly than PSE
- **Cost:** ~\$30/mo or \$240/yr (subscription)
- **Method:** Adobe Creative Cloud
- **Learning Curve:** more challenging
- **Notes:** automatic updates, look for software bundles, includes cloud storage

Specialized Programs



Photoshop Express ("quick photo retoucher")

- **Cost:** free app
- **Notes:** simple photo editor (photo filters, rotate, color adjust); doesn't support multi-layer editing, brushes etc.



Premiere Elements ("video production")

- **Cost:** ~\$99 (one-time fee)
- **Notes:** video editor; trim and edit videos, add effects & music for professional looking video & audio projects



Adobe Lightroom ("photographer's helper")

- **Cost:** ~\$10/mo or ~\$120/yr
- **Notes:** batch photo editor; uses presets and stores instructions for edits (nondestructive editing)



Adobe InDesign ("professional project layout")

- **Cost:** ~\$20/mo or ~\$240/yr
- **Notes:** cloud-based layout tool for pre-edited graphics & text; used by professional for print projects



Adobe Illustrator ("vector drawings / logos")

- **Cost:** ~\$20/mo or ~\$240/yr
- **Notes:** vector-based editing tool on the cloud; used by professionals to create logos & draw graphics



CorelDRAW ("vector painting & drawing")

- **Cost:** ~\$17/mo or ~\$200/yr
- **Notes:** vector-based editing tool on the cloud or for Windows; professionals use to create logos & draw graphics
