The Senior Director of Development will pursue philanthropic support from individuals, foundations, and corporations for the College of Environment, Forestry, and Natural Sciences (CEFNS). The Senior Director will be responsible for the overall leadership and management of the college's development efforts including the planning and direction of comprehensive strategies for the identification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of gift prospects for CEFNS. The Senior Director will oversee the work of gift officers, with a focus on principal and major gift development (defined at NAU as \$25,000 or more). The Senior Director will work with staff in Planned Giving, Annual Giving, and Corporate and Foundation Relations for NAU development as well as participate in strategic planning and interactions with volunteer and advisory boards. The Senior Director will collaborate and partner with colleagues and peers across campus while building strong donor relationships which will include significant personal interaction with alumni, friends, prospects, and donors.

Founded in 1899, Northern Arizona University is a public university centered on students. Its academic programs, research, public service, and creative endeavors enrich lives and create opportunities in Arizona and beyond. NAU develops solutions to challenges and drives innovation in a supportive, inclusive, and diverse environment. NAU is built on a student-first foundation — this was true when it opened its doors more than 100 years ago, and it's true now. Its traditions and values of the past inform its present and help it shape the future.

Over the past decade, NAU has seen tremendous growth in its student population, research agenda, and academic programming. New construction has enhanced a large portion of the 740-acre Flagstaff campus, increasing access and affordability for students across Arizona. Today NAU serves 31,000 students across 20-plus statewide locations and online. NAU offers over 150 undergraduate and graduate degree programs, all distinguished by an ongoing commitment to close student-faculty relationships and rigorous academic quality. Seven academic colleges, including a new College of Engineering, Informatics, and Applied Sciences provide increased options for fundraising. In addition, a strategically focused and innovative Alumni Engagement team is paving the way for greater and impactful engagement opportunities for generations of Lumberjacks.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

Fundraising

The Senior Director of Development, College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Science will

- prioritize, engage, and manage a major gifts portfolio of 70-100 prospects capable of philanthropically supporting CEFNS priorities;
- annually solicit and close 12-20 major gifts of \$25,000 or more in support of CEFNS and campaign priorities;
- be responsible for the overall leadership and management of the CEFNS development efforts;
- work across the college's six academic units and eight centers and institutes to support top priorities, and coach internal partners on fundraising strategies;
- facilitate interaction with prospects for the CEFNS Dean, faculty, staff, and other natural partners;
- participate fully in the University's comprehensive fundraising program, including its prospect management system;
- help set and then meet visit, contacts, and fundraising goals, and be directly accountable for those goals; and
- steward scholarship and award founders and donors who are not in the current major gifts portfolio.

Planning and goal setting

The Senior Director of Development, College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Science will

- develop an understanding of the mission and goals of NAU, including knowledge of CEFNS and its various units and major entities within the University; and
- work with CEFNS and NAU leadership, along with CEFNS faculty and staff, to identify prospective donors, establish strategic fundraising plans, and execute cultivation/solicitation strategies.

Management

The Senior Director of Development, College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Science will

- oversee and provide supportive leadership to two directors of development for assigned units/colleges; and
- provide guidance and donor connections to the college's scholarship/award processes.

Communication, Marketing, and Stewardship

The Senior Director of Development, College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Science will

- collaborate with the CEFNS Dean to set and communicate fundraising priorities and vision for meeting NAU's strategic goals with internal and external stakeholders;
- work with volunteers, advisory board members, and Foundation Board members to promote CEFNS and NAU; and
- collaborate with CEFNS Dean and director of Donor Relations on a comprehensive college-wide stewardship program to acknowledge and thank donors.

LEADERSHIP

José Luis Cruz Rivera President

José Luis Cruz Rivera began his tenure as the 17th President of Northern Arizona University (NAU) on June 14, 2021. Prior to joining NAU, Dr. Cruz Rivera served as President of Lehman College of The City University of New York and as Executive Vice Chancellor and University Provost of the 25-campus system. During Cruz Rivera's tenure at CUNY, Lehman College enhanced its national reputation as an engine of social mobility, and the Central Office of Academic Affairs registered important accomplishments on behalf of the University's more than 20,000 faculty members, 26,000 professional staff, and 500,000 students and learners.

A leading national advocate for policies to expand opportunities and improve educational outcomes for all students — especially those who have historically been underserved — Cruz Rivera is a frequent keynote speaker and writer on higher education issues. He has testified several times before the U.S. Congress, and his work has been covered by many media outlets, including *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, and *Univision*.

Previously, Cruz Rivera served as provost of California State University, Fullerton. He is a former vice president of Higher Education Policy and Practice at The Education Trust in Washington, D.C. and a former Chief Student Affairs Officer for the University of Puerto Rico system. He began his career as a faculty member in engineering at the University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez, rising through the ranks and serving as Chair of the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department and Dean of Academic Affairs.

Cruz Rivera chairs the board of directors of The Education Trust and serves on the board of the Data Quality Campaign. He is also a member of the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) advisory board, the Anchor Institutions Task Force, and the steering committee of the Presidents' Alliance on

Higher Education and Immigration. In the past, he has served on the board of directors of the New York Botanical Garden, the Institute for Higher Education Policy, the Regional Plan Association, and the Association of Chief Academic Officers. He has also served as a member of the Community Advisory Group of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, the advisory board of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Committee on Academic Innovation and Transformation, and as a commissioner on the Postsecondary Value Commission.

Cruz Rivera is a Senior Member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, a patented inventor, and a National Science Foundation Career Award recipient. His work as a faculty member on optical interconnections for massively parallel processing systems was published in scientific journals and presented at international conferences. He earned his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering (magna cum laude) from the University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez and his master's and doctorate degrees from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He is an alumnus of the Harvard Institute of Educational Management.

Jason Wilder

Dean, College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Sciences

Jason Wilder has served as the Dean of the College of the Environment, Forestry, and Natural Sciences, since May of 2019. Wilder has worked at NAU for more than 13 years and held numerous positions, including the Director of the Biomedical Science Program and Chair of the Department of Biological Sciences. Prior to arriving at NAU, Wilder held the positions of Assistant Professor at Williams College and Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Arizona.

Wilder's career as a faculty member at NAU is distinguished by a deep commitment to teaching and mentoring students, coupled with a strong record of scholarly publications and extramural funding. His passion and combination of proven visionary academic leadership, well-honed administrative skills, and success as a teacher-scholar has helped him create an academic environment that offers exceptional opportunities for students to learn and engage with science while also fostering an environment that empowers NAU scientists to thrive as international leaders in research and discovery.

Wilder received his B.A. in Biology from Williams College and his Ph.D. in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology from Princeton. He did his postdoctoral research in the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and Division of Biotechnology at the University of Arizona. Wilder has a strong record of research, funded primarily by the National Science Foundation and National Cancer Institute, and his work has been published in the scientific journals Nature Genetics, Evolution, Genetics, Heredity, and Human Biology — among others. He currently serves as a Principal Investigator for "The Partnership for Native American Cancer Prevention", a \$6.8M grant to NAU funded by the National Cancer Institute.

Bonnie Baker

Associate Vice President, Advancement

Bonnie Baker is the Associate Vice President, Advancement at Northern Arizona University, responsible for multiple college-based fundraising units while also overseeing the annual giving and prospect development teams. Baker is a forward-thinking development professional with 20 years of demonstrated success in fundraising and non-profit management. Previously, Baker served as Director of Development for the Grand Canyon Association supporting Grand Canyon National Park. Other roles include Executive Director for the Crested Butte Nordic Council and Director of Public Affairs for the Baker Institute for Animal Health at Cornell University. Baker discovered her passion for development and fundraising while serving as a volunteer for public radio in Colorado. She holds a bachelor's degree in English from the College of the Holy Cross.

- strong organizational and planning skills with the ability to initiate, collaborate, implement, monitor, evaluate, advance, and report on strategic plans that support the activities of, and contribute to, the overall goals and objectives of NAU and Development and Alumni Engagement;
- superior interpersonal skills with an ability to successfully interact and collaborate with varied constituencies in a professional manner, exhibiting excellent communication skills, and demonstrating tact, poise, and diplomacy while working with a wide variety of personalities;
- experience as a team player with the ability to gain trust and confidence of colleagues and constituents;
- experience and credibility when presenting materials to both internal and external constituents, including individuals from a variety of culturally diverse backgrounds;
- a commitment to excellence, honesty, transparency, and high levels of collaboration;
- attention to detail and an ability to work independently and manage multiple projects and priorities to meet aggressive timelines and challenging deadlines with minimal staff support;
- an entrepreneurial spirit and an ability to take initiative and actively seek to deepen current donor relationships and forge new ones;
- experience working with sensitive information and ability to maintain strict confidentiality;
- experience in major gift fundraising principles and practices at a major university;
- comprehensive campaign experience (preferred)
- an ability to engage, motivate, and work with prospects, volunteers, university officials, faculty, and staff or similar constituencies;
- a working knowledge of a donor databases;
- an ability to work independently; a self-starter with energy, humility, and enthusiasm
- an interest in the sciences.

A bachelor's degree is required for this position as is at least five years of experience as a front-line fundraiser in a comprehensive development program or equivalent experience in a related field, such as corporate sales.

The salary range for this position is \$95,809 to \$143,713 annually. Northern Arizona University offers a comprehensive benefits package.

LOCATION

Northern Arizona University is located in Flagstaff, Arizona. NAU will consider candidates throughout Arizona with a preference for the Flagstaff area. The Senior Director must be able and willing to travel frequently throughout the United States to attend relevant programs and events, and to meet with current and prospective donors to further cultivation and solicitation strategies (approximately 25-50% time).
