VOCABULARY

daydreaming – spending time during the day thinking about thinks you would rather be doing rather than doing your work

hit the jackpot - win a large amount of money, get lucky

give it some thought - think about something for a while in order to make a decision

go on a spending spree – spend a large amount of money in a short period of time, often on unnecessary things

blow money - spend all you money on things you don't need, waste all your money

luxury - high quality, high class, expensive

a lack of time - not enough time

help needy people - help people who need it the most

charity - an organisation that helps people in need

a real sense of satisfaction – a very positive feeling from doing something good



GRAMMAR

Second conditional

If I won the lottery, I would travel around the world I would travel around the world if I won the lottery

Use the **second conditional** to talk about an <u>unreal present or future</u> situation

This situation is <u>unlikely</u> or <u>impossible</u>

Use <u>if + past simple</u>, <u>would/may/might/could (not) + infinitive</u> (without 'to') to make the **second conditional**
