## Lesson 1:

## Learning Objectives:

Students will learn the process for buying school lunch. This is a skill they will be able to practice daily at lunch time. As students become more familiar the process, adult prompting can be faded out and students can become more independent.

## Full Class Activity:

- Print slides from power point and as a class, go through the steps by taping them to the board. Of course, if you have a smart board, even better! Have students help drag steps in order they should be demonstrated.

Independent Working Time:

- Sequencing activity


## Wrap up/Closing:

- Review the steps as a class.
- Remind students they'll get to practice daily if they are buying lunch! If not, still good to know in case they have to buy lunch one day or need to help a friend.

## Buying Lunch in the Cafeteria

## Lesson 2:

## Learning Objectives:

Students will learn the process for buying school lunch. This is a skill they will be able to practice daily at lunch time. As students become more familiar the process, adult prompting can be faded out and students can become more independent.

Materials \& Preparation:

- Buying Lunch in the Cafeteria power point (to review)
- Tray, empty containers, silverware, condiments etc. (please go to your school cafeteria and ask for these).
- What is an Entrée worksheet
- What is a side dish worksheet

Instruction:

- Buying Lunch in the Cafeteria power point
- Review power point and go through sequence of steps as a class


## Full Class Activity:

- Role Play - Buying lunch. Ask your school if you can have an empty tray, a few empty containers they use etc. Set up the desks into a line and have students practice buying lunch in your classroom.
- You be the cashier. If you have other staff to play cafeteria workers as well, even better!

Independent Working Time:

- What is an Entrée?
- What is a side dish?


## Wrap up/Closing:

- Review the steps that each student demonstrated during the activity.


## Other Ideas for Activities:

- Take pictures of the students demonstrating these steps individually one day (when lunch is not actually happening). Have them sequence the
steps they did. This may help with sequencing, seeing themselves demonstrating skills as well as remembering what they did.
