The Aspen Leadership Group is proud to partner with Catskill Animal Sanctuary in the search for a Director of Development.

This creative and innovative person will work with leadership to plan and execute fundraising strategies to elevate and enhance Catskill Animal Sanctuary's image and position as it moves to the national stage. The Director of Development will participate in shaping the strategic direction of the organization, and will be responsible for the creation and oversight of a comprehensive development plan that includes major gifts, grants, planned giving, on-line and traditional appeals, member cultivation, and partnership with the Executive Director and Board of Directors to cultivate and solicit significant gifts. Additionally, the Director of Development will participate in the development and management of a comprehensive communications plan that promotes the organization's mission, brand, people, and services in a way that distinguishes it from all others, and will provide leadership and supervision to staff to attain success.

The successful candidate will have a deep personal commitment to veganism, and will be an innovator with outstanding interpersonal skills and a proven track record of driving while flying. The Director of Development will supervise a staff of four—communications manager, communications associate, donor relations manager, and coordinator of the animal sponsorship program—and will engage with the Executive Director/Founder in leveraging her role in advancing the organization's mission.

Catskill Animal Sanctuary is a 150-acre refuge in New York's Hudson Valley for eleven species of farmed animals rescued from cruelty, neglect, and abandonment. The Catskill mission is to rescue farmed animals, ignite social change to end their exploitation, and champion vegan living.

In addition to direct animal aid, the Sanctuary offers signature programming aimed at encouraging its guests and the world at large to adopt a plant-based lifestyle. Programming includes customized tours, a vegan cooking program, adult vegan mentoring, a children's summer camp, and youth leadership programs which are positioned to become national models. In addition to programming, the historical Homestead building serves as a Bed and Breakfast venue for guests to enjoy a more in-depth and personal experience of the Sanctuary.

During this period of growth, Catskill's aim is to increase its reach and impact through mission-driven programming. As a result, it must rapidly grow its fundraising capacity to support and sustain such growth. Likewise, due to the demands of the position and its location 2 hours from New York City, the successful candidate will live within the surrounding area—this requirement affords them the flexibility to be on-site 30% or more, as well as in the field to cultivate and grow the New York City donor base.

PRINCIPAL OPPORTUNITIES

Since its inception 15 years ago, Catskill Animal Sanctuary has become one of the world's leading sanctuaries for farmed animals, having saved over 4,000 animals through direct emergency rescue and exponentially more through groundbreaking programming that supports humans in their journey toward plant-based living.

Having transformed 150 acres into a true haven for animals, Catskill is now poised to expand its reach and deepen its impact through new and “refreshed” programs that it hopes will become national models—a mentoring program, a youth leadership program, and a vegan culinary program—and through the construction of an Institute for Compassionate Living from which its programming will operate. In addition, the Sanctuary is implementing ongoing formal evaluation of its programs as a first step in offering a Best Practices model to the Sanctuary movement.

The Development Director will join a remarkable group of people who truly live its mantra of “love spoken here”—a mantra that filters through the entire organization, impacting not only external communications, but its *internal* culture as well. Moreover, Catskill has an unblemished record of fiscal accountability and transparency (Charity Navigator's top-ranked farmed animal sanctuary in the nation), numerous healthy income streams, a strong balance sheet and zero debt. This is an opportune moment in its history for a poised, passionate, and visionary fundraising professional to help catapult the Sanctuary to become a national leader for our vital and urgent movement.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Director of Development will

- establish, implement, and regularly review a comprehensive organizational development plan that enhances Catskill's image and position and expands fundraising capacity;
- develop and implement strategies for recruiting, cultivating, and stewarding individual donors, including strategies to engage and retain new donor stakeholders and increase major gifts;
- advance and maintain relationships with corporations and implement strategies to increase corporate giving;
- lead the planning and implementation of development goals, strategies, and activities relating to the identification, research, cultivation, and solicitation of prospective donors;
- work closely with staff, leadership, and board to educate and engage them in donor solicitation and the entire fundraising process;
- oversee development team in writing and editing of grants, proposals, reports, and other materials;
- maintain supervision of marketing strategies to promote brand, increase visibility, and participation in programs, services, and activities;

- oversee Marketing and Communication team's content, coordination of staff, and vendors to produce all print, digital, and social media activities as to be in line with development efforts;
- ensure integration of staff with other organization teams through supervision of staff, consultants, and volunteers to meet goals; and
- manage performance, offer coaching, guide professional development, and provide structured feedback.

The successful candidate for the position of Director of Development should have

- deep personal commitment to a vegan lifestyle and knowledge of issues related to farmed animal rights;
- track record of meaningful engagement with major donors, community decision makers, business owners, and corporate donors on multiple levels;
- experience directing teams for donor cultivation programs, fundraising events, and outreach campaigns;
- proven ability to raise income budgets in excess of \$2M;
- strong creative, strategic, analytical, and organizational skills;
- sophisticated messaging and framing talents that have demonstrated success and can be used as a model for others;
- aptitude for cultivating collaborative relationships with staff, donors, and partner organizations that foster a culture of excellence;
- robust time and project management skills with the ability to manage multiple projects, timelines and priorities;
- a strong vision and desire for personal growth with a positive attitude;
- strong track record of success in leading fundraising efforts from a broad base of stakeholders, including individuals, foundations, and events;
- proven ability to lead development-related communications;
- excellent communication, public speaking, and writing skills; and
- proficiency in MS Office, Neon or similar fundraising and/or donor management software.

A Bachelor's degree from an accredited university is required for this position as is a minimum of 5 years of experience in major gift fundraising with a minimum of 2 years in a management role.
