The Director of Individual Giving will lead a NYC-based major gifts team focused on growing Wildlife Conservation Society's (WCS) private revenue. The Director will oversee the major gift program for the critical New York region, including identifying, cultivating, and soliciting individuals in support of WCS's vital mission. The Director will manage a high-value portfolio of donors with the capacity to give at the five-, six-, and seven-figure levels and work directly with Trustees and leadership donors to accelerate giving in the region. The Director will serve as a leading member of WCS's Individual Giving Team, which is responsible for generating \$40M+ in significant individual gifts annually contributing towards an overall departmental goal of \$100M+ a year in private philanthropy. The Director will be instrumental in helping WCS save 50% of the world's biodiversity, create nature-based solutions to climate change, and inspire the next generation of conservationists through its world-class zoos and aquarium and more.

WCS stands for wildlife and wild places. As the world's premier wildlife conservation organization, WCS has a long track record of achieving innovative, impactful results at scale. It runs field programs spanning 60 countries and the entire ocean. It builds on a unique foundation: its reach is global; it discovers through best-in-class science; it protects through work on the ground with local and indigenous people; it inspires through its world-class zoos, aquarium, and education programs; and it leverages its resources through partnerships and powerful policy influence. With more than 4,000 diverse, passionately committed team members in New York City and around the world, WCS works collectively to achieve its conservation mission.

WCS's goal is to conserve the world's largest wild places in 14 priority regions, home to more than 50% of the world's biodiversity. This is outlined in its <u>2020 Strategy</u>, which positions WCS to maintain its historic focus on the protection of species while developing an ambitious plan to engage with a rapidly changing world. The challenges are greater than ever, but with the focus, dedication, and passion of a committed staff—combined with a unique mixture of field, zoo, and aquarium expertise—WCS continues to set the bar for science, conservation action, and education that has driven its success in protecting wildlife and wild places for over a century. It holds itself to the highest standards, adhering to core values of respect, accountability and transparency, innovation, diversity and inclusion, collaboration, and integrity.

# WILDLIFE CONSERVATION SOCIETY'S COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

Wildlife Conservation Society values staff and community partners from all backgrounds and cultures with different skills, abilities, and perspectives. It is committed to ensuring that everyone has an opportunity to fully contribute to its mission.

# PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Director of Individual Giving will

- create and lead the strategy for a portfolio of major and principal gift donors and prospects;
- manage a portfolio of 100+ donors at the \$25K level along with seven- to eight-figure prospects;
- develop bespoke cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship plans for each donor;

- provide leadership and coaching to four fundraising professional direct reports by providing guidance and strategic counsel to advance their portfolios and professional development;
- collaborate with the Chief Executive Officer, Executive Vice President, and Vice President of Individual Giving on the management of select high-capacity donors, including support for meeting preparation and follow up;
- partner with and support WCS's Trustees, Council members, and senior leadership to make the best use of their time and talent to bolster fundraising efforts and ensure their effectiveness as WCS ambassadors;
- establish supportive and cooperative working relationships with other Global Resources fundraisers in Individual Giving and Institutional Advancement, share best practices and new ideas, and collaborate on donor cultivation when needed;
- encourage and model a culture of Salesforce utilization to track and evaluate key performance metrics and activities, in close collaboration with the Donor Services Team;
- conduct and oversee data analysis to continually improve practices, drive action, and inform decisions across the team;
- build and manage meaningful relationships with prospects and donors through visits, correspondence, and consistent communication;
- with the support of the Research Team, continue to build a qualified pipeline of new prospects and implement effective donor engagement opportunities;
- develop and maintain familiarity with programmatic needs, budgets, and priorities for the Zoos and Aquarium and the Global Conservation Program;
- represent WCS's mission and persuasively articulate WCS's impact and conservation strategies;
- ensure the timely creation and distribution of customized fundraising and stewardship materials, collateral and briefings, and highly personalized proposals with support from the Global Resources Communications Team; and
- working with the WCS Donor Special Events teams, design and execute WCS events in the region that maximize major donor and prospect cultivation opportunities, and serve as a lead for these opportunities.
