




What is the California Seal of Biliteracy?

- The State Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by a school, school district, county office of education or state in recognition of students who have studied and attained **proficiency** in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to English by high school graduation.

Seal Requirements

What are the requirements for the California Seal of Bilingualism?

Students whose primary language is English: Each of these 3 academic fields shall be fulfilled:

1. English ELA classes with 2.0 or above GPA
2. Pass the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) for English language arts, or any successor test, administered in grade eleven, at or above the “standard met” achievement level... score of 3 or above
3. Student must demonstrate proficiency in one or more languages than English through one of the following methods:
 - a) Pass AP Spanish Language Exam with 3 or higher
 - b) Successfully complete a 4-year high school course of study in a foreign language and attain an overall GPA of 3.0 or above in that course of study.
 - c) Pass the SAT II foreign language exam with score 600 or higher
