


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Grammar Used to Tell Both Stories





Past Simple

Then she called on kids to continue reading where she left off, and so on. When she called on me, I just drew a blank.



This isn't me by the way.



Present Simple

To bring a vividness to the story.

I'm seven, I have no idea what's going on...
We get to the office, and turns out she has a gift for me.





Present Progressive

To bring vividness to continuous actions.

I'm just sitting in the office holding the doll, wondering when I can go back to my classroom.





Used to + verb

Facts, generalizations, or habits in the past.

... [my sisters] used to follow me around and listen to everything I said because they looked up to me.





Past Progressive, Past Perfect, Would

So here, I was battling with all these emotions and didn't feel like anyone was supportive.

The same as Present Progressive, but with less vividness.

I wasn't sure if I had even done anything wrong.

The past of the past. Past Simple also works equally as well.

I would just react to the conversation and go with the flow.

Repetition in the past.


