The Associate Director of Gift Planning will manage the on-going identification, qualification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of approximately 125 gift planning and leadership gift donors and prospects and assist in the design, marketing, and management of the College's Gift Planning program.

Founded at a pivotal time in American history, Gettysburg College has upheld a rigorous commitment to the liberal arts since 1832. Since before the Civil War, the College has stood as a beacon of intellectualism and socially responsible citizenship. Located in the historic town of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, the College is within two hours of the urban centers of Baltimore, Washington, D.C., and Philadelphia. Students can choose from 40 majors and 40 minors that go beyond the traditional liberal arts education with a focus on experiential learning. An average class size of 18, and a 10 to 1 student to faculty-ratio, means professors are accessible and available to support student success. Its 2,400 students from across the country, and globe, are provided with a wealth of opportunities to get involved outside the classroom. More than 120 clubs and organizations ensure that there will be something for everyone and provide a multitude of leadership experiences. Gettysburg College fields 24 varsity sports—12 for men and 12 for women—that compete at the NCAA Division III intercollegiate level. It is a founding member of the Centennial Conference, home to some of the nation's finest liberal arts colleges committed to excellence in both academics and athletics.

As a residential, undergraduate college of the liberal arts and sciences, Gettysburg College prepares students from across the nation and around the globe to pursue lives of personal and professional fulfillment, and to engage in society through effective leadership and socially responsible citizenship. In March of 2022, the Board of Trustees approved Gettysburg's new strategic plan, [*Living Our Promise*](#), with the goal to inspire students to lead lives of meaning, service, and consequence. The plan advances this essential work and marries the excellence of a rigorous liberal arts and sciences education with a student experience that intentionally integrates learning that occurs inside and outside of the classroom.

Gettysburg College is recognized nationally and ranks among top colleges in the country for value, programs, and liberal arts experience. The College appears several times on the *Princeton Review* "Best 388 Colleges" list. It is number 15 in 'Best Campus Food,' 16th in 'Students Study the Most,' as well as being recognized in 'Best Value Colleges,' 'Colleges That Create Futures,' 'Green Colleges,' and 'Great Intramural Sports.' *Washington Monthly* has recognized Gettysburg as 29th in liberal arts and 43rd in "Best Bang for the Buck" colleges in the Northeast. In addition, it is ranked among the Best Colleges by *U.S. News & World Report*—61st in liberal arts, 54th in 'Best Value Schools,' and 49th in 'Best Undergraduate Teaching.'

Gettysburg College was also named a Top Producing Institution for the Fulbright Program in 2021. The College has a history of producing prominent graduates across many fields—alumni include a Nobel Prize-winning cancer researcher, a former Texas Congressman and Presidential Candidate, former NAACP President, an Oscar-nominated cinematographer, and a Newbery Medalist, among others. Gettysburg College boasts an impressive 98% rate for alumni employed or attending graduate school or pursuing further education within a year after graduation. This strong network of alumni is spread across all 50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Canada, and in five continents to offer support to fellow alumni, and the College.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Associate Director of Gift Planning will

- assist in the development and implementation of fundraising strategies to increase constituent awareness and understanding of gift planning opportunities;
- cultivate and steward relationships with approximately 125 assigned donor prospects, with a focus on gift planning prospects;
- interact with donors and donor prospects extensively both in-person and virtually including at least 125 personal visits annually and personal outreach to 100% of portfolio;
- work with assigned donors and prospects and their legal, financial, and tax advisors in the execution of planned gifts and prepare gift illustrations for various types of planned gifts;
- draft letters, proposals, and endowment agreements;
- assist in the creation of gift planning marketing communication materials;
- assist with gift planning-specific events and attend other all-division events, such as Homecoming and Reunion;
- advise other gift officers on gift planning strategies for their prospects;
- assist with the development and implementation of the 50th Reunion gift planning goal and fundraising strategy and serve as the gift planning representative on the 50th Reunion Committee;
- assist in the development of gift planning professional development and training opportunities for gift officers;
- coordinate with research staff to identify new gift planning prospects;
- maintain records and contact reports on gift planning donors and prospects in the database;
- keep abreast of changes in tax law and philanthropic trends related to gift planning arrangements; and
- set annual metric target goals with the Director of Gift Planning.

LEADERSHIP

Clarence "Tres" Mullis

Vice President for College Advancement

Clarence "Tres" Mullis was appointed to serve as Gettysburg's Vice President for College Advancement effective February 24, 2020. Mullis joined Gettysburg after a successful 25-year career in higher education. Most recently, he served as Executive Director of University Development at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia, where he led a \$500 million fundraising campaign. Previously, Mullis led fundraising efforts at the Peabody College for Education and Human Development at Vanderbilt University, and the alumni relations and development program at Austin Peay State University. He also worked in development for his alma mater, Stetson University. Mullis first became involved with the college in 2013 when he was asked to assess and make recommendations for Gettysburg's parent fundraising program.

Caitlyn Walters

Caitlyn Walters, Esq. received her B.A. in Political Science from Dickinson College and her J.D. from the George Washington University Law School. After graduation, Walters practiced trust and estate law in Maryland before switching careers to work in development. She spent six years running annual giving programs at the Barnesville School and The Lab School of Washington, independent schools in and around Washington, DC. In 2018, Walters joined Gettysburg College as a Major Gifts Officer before becoming the Director of Gift Planning in 2019.

- experience successfully cultivating and stewarding donors in-person and virtually in pursuit of philanthropic support;
- knowledge of common gift planning, estate, and financial planning or wealth planning vehicles and an understanding of tax law as it pertains to the role;
- exceptional oral and written communication skills;
- an ability to foster and develop new relationships;
- a high degree of motivation and an ability to motivate others and work harmoniously with various individuals;
- an ability to work independently and in a team setting; and
- fluency with Microsoft Office software applications.

Gettysburg College will consider candidates with a broad range of backgrounds. A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience and fundraising or relevant experience in financial planning, wealth management, or estate planning is preferred.
