Squash SA will support players who attend interstate events where eight or more junior players register an EOI. After eight players the ratio of players to officials/chaperones must no greater than 1:6. Squash will support the event by covering the costs of coaches/chaperones travel, accommodation and expenses.

Events that will be considered a priority are the AJO and interstate state titles of states that either support the SA Junior Age or state titles that are deemed valuable to attend for ranking points purposes or valuable exposure/experience.

This policy does not cover the Australian Junior Championships (AJC) where the AJC State Team Policy - SSA002 is used.

All Development Squad members will be encouraged to attend these tournaments in order to gain a better national ranking, therefore creating better seeding's at the AJC.

Requirements:

All Squash SA coaches, chaperones and employees travelling with Development Squad players must hold a current police clearance certificate and have the certificate number and expiry recorded with Squash SA.

Development Squad and Elite Talent Squad Players will be invoiced after returning from the tournament/tour.

Costs will be split evenly between players.

The decision to drive or fly to an event will be made by the Coaching Team Leader after consultation with the Junior Coordination and Advisory committee.

Accommodation will be at the discretion of the Coaching Team Leader with affordability, comfort, location and facilities considered.
