

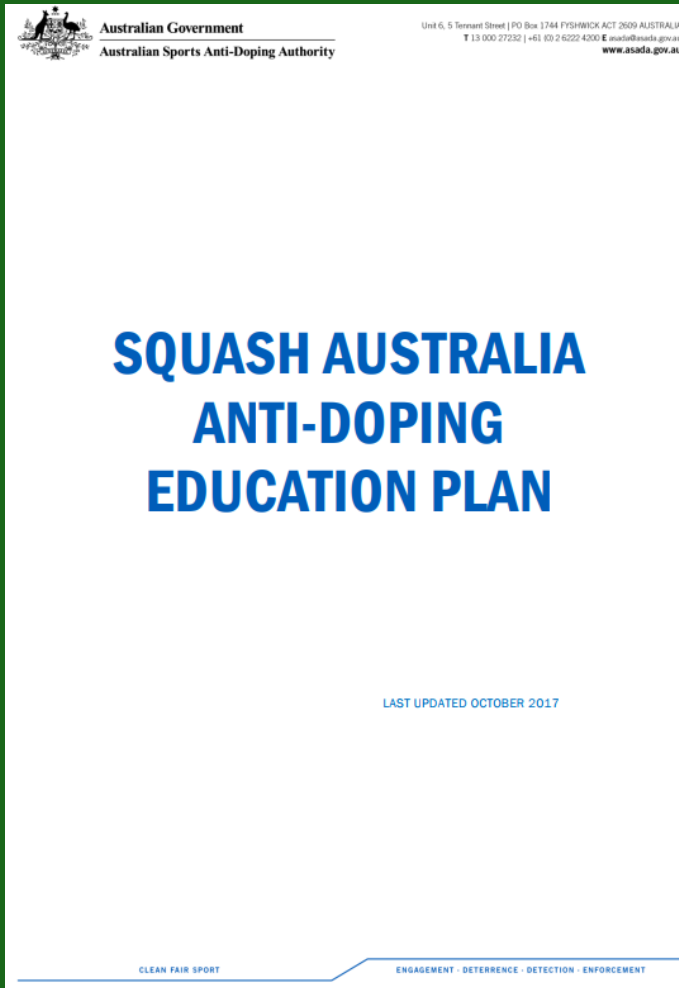


**INTEGRITY

INTEGRITY

- ▶ Squash Australia has a vested interest in ensuring that Australian squash players, coaches, referees and other involved individuals are educated on and therefore protected from doping and match-fixing.
- ▶ Squash Australia works together with the following organisations to ensure Australian squash players are educated and protected:
 - ▶ **ASADA (Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority)** - As Australia's national anti-doping organisation, ASADA is responsible for implementing an effective program consistent with international requirements and Australian legislation. ASADA protects the health of athletes and integrity of Australian sport.
 - ▶ **NISU (National Integrity of Sport Unit)** - Established in 2012, NISU sits within the Australian Government's Department of Health providing oversight, monitoring and coordination of efforts to protect the integrity of sport in Australia from threats of doping, match-fixing and other forms of corruption.
- ▶ Separate from these requirements are other legal standards that Squash Australia and its members must meet:
 - ▶ Working with Children Checks or equivalent

SA ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION PLAN



- ▶ Borne out of Squash Australia's relationship with ASADA is the Anti-Doping Education Plan
- ▶ This document outlines what is required of which relevant individuals with regards to anti-doping education

SA MATCH-FIXING POLICY



- ▶ Section 2.3 of Squash Australia’s Match-Fixing Policy states the requirements of all relevant persons
- ▶ The Match-Fixing Policy aligns with NISU standards
- ▶ The document also contains a Code of Conduct and process of investigations, hearings and appeals with regards to match-fixing allegations.

2017 AUSTRALIAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS



- ▶ At the 2017 AJC, Squash Australia trialled mandatory integrity requirements
 - ▶ All players (individual and teams) had to complete ASADA Level 1 and Match-Fixing
- ▶ This requirement was stipulated in Squash Australia's previous Education Plan.
- ▶ Following the feedback received from the 2017 AJC, the Education Plan was amended with ASADA to exclude u15 players from completing ASADA and Match-Fixing
 - ▶ All state players over 15 must complete ASADA Level 1 and Match-Fixing
