



GAM NET CHAPMAN PENALTY PROCEDURES



The Tournament shall consist of 18 holes of Chapman Stroke Play. Two players play as partners, each playing from the teeing ground and each playing their partner's ball for the second shot. After the second shot, partners select the ball with which they wish to score, and play that ball alternately to complete the hole.

NOTE: In this format, a player never makes a stroke at his/her own ball two times in a row.

The ball chosen is the ball in play and shall not be substituted unless otherwise provided in the Rules of Golf.

NOTE: Penalty strokes do not affect the order of play

Rule 22.3: If the partners play a stroke or strokes in incorrect order, such stroke or strokes shall be canceled and the side shall incur a penalty of two strokes. The side shall correct the error by playing a ball in correct order as nearly as possible at the spot from which it played in incorrect order. If not corrected before teeing off on the next hole, the side shall be disqualified.

PROCEDURE AFTER HITTING A TEE SHOT IN A PENALTY AREA

- If Player A hits his tee shot into a penalty area, the team must choose an applicable penalty area option, and Player B must hit the next shot for that ball. That stroke would count as the third stroke for that ball. Presuming Player B's tee shot did not find a penalty area, Player A hits that ball next with it being the second stroke for that ball. The team then selects which ball to finish the hole with. Should they select the ball Player A hit from the tee, the team is laying three. If they opt for the ball Player B hit from the tee, the team is laying two.

HITTING THE THIRD SHOT INTO A PENALTY AREA

- If Player A hit the team's third shot into a penalty area, it is now her partner, Player B's turn, and they are now hitting five (5).

PLAYING A PROVISIONAL AFTER A WAYWARD TEE SHOT

- If Player A hits her ball off the tee into an area where the ball might be lost or out of bounds, and A-B decide to hit a provisional ball, Player B hits the provisional ball. If Player B has not put a ball into play from the tee, she must hit her tee shot first and then announce she is hitting a provisional ball. **The provisional ball MUST be played from the teeing ground the original stroke was played from.**

TAKING AN UNPLAYABLE LIE

- Player A's tee shot has come to rest in a position where it is unplayable. After using an unplayable lie option, Player B will play the next shot and either player can perform a drop.

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
