Congratulations to **Alex Eustace** (cover) for his solid performances at the World Junior Championships.

Eustace led the way delivering with his team mates the best result for an Australian Boys team since 2002. Their 7th place finish exceeded their initial seeding of 10.

Nicholas Calvert and Jon van der Kreek also participated at the WJC.

From a PSA perspective it will be Queensland's turn to host a number of PSA M5 and W5 events in the coming months. Graded events will also be on offer at the Queensland Open and Mackay Open.

It is a wonderful opportunity to not only see a number of international players but to see our best line up against the rest!

The **Queensland Open** will be played at Nerang from 20-23 October. This will then be followed by the **Mackay Open** from 27-30 October and finally, the **Cairns International** (a new event) from 4-6 November.

Nerang Squash Centre will also host the **Jupiters Pan Pacific Masters Games** from November.

It is vitally important that as many players support these events as possible. These days it is becoming increasingly challenging, particularly financially, to offer these events.

They are critical for the development of our young players and to demonstrate clearly that our sport is alive and moving positively forward.

A segment called **Squash Insider** has been developed to promote our champions and help readers get to know a little more about each of them. 2016 State Junior Champion **Taylor Jones** features in the first one.

OUR PSA PLAYERS

Zac Alexander was named Squash Player Magazine's Player of the Month for July. Congratulations Zac!

Alexander's magnificent 31 match winning streak came to an abrupt end at the Australian Open when he lost his second round match to Kiwi Paul Coll 10-12, 14-16, 5-11 (53m).

But every cloud has a silver lining! Alexander got a call up to represent Australia at the World Doubles Championship in Darwin. Alexander replaced the injured Rex Hedrick. With partner David Palmer, Queensland's best won a silver medal in the Men's Doubles.

Rachael Grinham with partner Donna Urquhart also won a silver medal in the Women's Doubles at the World Doubles Championship in Darwin

Matthew Hopkin captured his fourth PSA World Tour title after overcoming #6 seed Martin Svec (CZE) in the final of the Zenit Black Sea Open (PSA M5) in Odessa, Ukraine. Hopkin (seeded #1) won 11-6, 11-8, 14-12.

Tom Calvert reached the second round of the Victorian Open with a first round win over David Clegg 11-6, 10-12, 11-2, 11-5 (38m). Despite his second round match lasting 41 minutes, Calvert found #6 seed Arthur Gaskin from Ireland too strong losing 8-11, 6-11, 4-11.

Alex Eustace represented Australia at the World Junior Championships. The team finished 7th which was higher than their seeding of 10. Eustace was a significant contributor to the best result by an Aussie Junior Men's team since 2002.

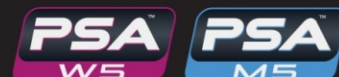

TAYLOR JONES

Once in a while a special kid comes along with stars in their eyes. Only the future determines whether or not they become stars but attitude plays a key role in their destiny.

Queenslander **Taylor Jones** has a very good attitude and has the potential to become one of our brightest squash stars.

The 16 year old from Brisbane has just won the U17 and U19 double at the Queensland Junior State Championships.

"It was a major goal of mine to win the double title and it's such a great feeling to achieve goals that are a stretch and knowing that all my hard work is finally, starting to pay off" said Jones on her return to Brisbane.

To cap off a memorable week the talented teenager also won the coveted Rachael Grinham Achievement Award.

"For me, Rachael is one of Australia's greatest female players, so it's a real honour to be given an award in her name and to join the list of players who have received it previously".

Her coach Lisa Camilleri knows exactly how it feels to win a double and was very proud of her young charge.

Camilleri herself was a multiple Queensland Junior Champ (11 titles) and as a professional rose to #28 in the World.

"Taylor has great work ethic and is someone who, when she puts her mind to something, will do whatever she needs to do to achieve it" said Camilleri.

Jones has joined the PSA World Tour and is currently 164 in the World rankings. She knows she has a long way to go but once again her attitude shines through.

"I'm a long way off being a professional player, but it's a great experience and shows me what I need to do to be competitive at these events".

Jones is currently training for the Australian Junior Championships to be held in Sydney from 24 September to 2nd October.

Jones will most likely be Queensland's #1 in the Under 19 Girls Sharks Team and will be doing her absolute best to stretch Queensland's winning streak from 12 consecutive overall team titles to 13!

"Maintaining that winning streak is important to me. I always feel motivated to do my best for the team".

Her best result in the individuals at the AJC was 4th place in Under 15 in 2014. Winning a National title is still her aim but when questioned about her main rivals Jones was clear.

"I think that Alex Haydon is the form female player right now. However, anyone with a racquet is a rival on the court. So it doesn't matter whether it's the first round or the final, I approach each match giving my opponent due respect".

There is no doubt Taylor Jones is a champion both on and off the court.

She is just a normal teenage girl who loves squash and has the potential to be

a wonderful role model for younger players. She is certainly considerate and respectful.

TJ enjoys training, competing and doing her best. She loves being a member of the Queensland Sharks and as a senior member of the team is looking to lead by example.

She has great determination and a “never say die” attitude. She keeps training to improve her game and looks forward to competing at all levels.

With such a great attitude Jones is destined to succeed. We wish her well at the 2016 AJC.

Quick Questions

What are your aspirations?

I would like to be good enough one day to make squash a career, and to play for Australia.

How often do you train?

I train or play at least once a day, 6 days a week, on or off the court.

Is there a female squash player that you admire?

If I was to pick one, it would be Nouran Gohar, because of her consistency, attitude and determination, and her attacking style of play. Lakeesha Rarere is also a great role model and mentor for me having worked hard to achieve so much in junior squash.

Would you describe yourself as an introvert or an extrovert?

I don't know. Maybe a bit of both! I get very focused when I'm at tournaments, so maybe seem more introverted then. But I can be pretty confident and outgoing at the same time.

If you're not a professional squash player at 25 what do you think you would like to be doing?

I'm not sure, but something to do with sports. Maybe a sports physiologist or physiotherapist. Hopefully I won't have to worry about that, but I'm not set on the back up plan yet.
