The Senior Manager, Major Gifts will partner with the Director of Development, while working closely with members of the U.S. Development team and liaise with colleagues across different departments at the headquarters office in New York and Orbis offices worldwide.

Orbis International is a non-profit that brings people together to fight avoidable blindness. With its network of partners, it mentors, trains, and inspires local teams to fight blindness in their communities. Orbis believes that no one should live a life of unnecessary blindness, simply because of where they were born. Its mission is to use its amazing network of partners, supporters, staff, and sector leading volunteers to empower local communities with the skills and resources necessary to fight blindness on their own. It works alongside eye teams in communities to provide training and guidance to leave a long-term eye care legacy that will restore vision for generations to come. Orbis builds its networks on trust and commitment and seeks to collaborate with corporate partners, fellow NGOs, and local hospitals. It has made a promise to local eye teams to always strive for excellent, sustainable results that will suit its local partners' needs.

Training and collaboration is at the very heart of everything Orbis does. With the help of its world-leading volunteers, it provides training to all types of healthcare workers – from doctors and nurses in regional hospitals to district leaders and teachers in remote areas. But most don't have access to care. 90% live in low- and middle-income countries where there are too few eye doctors, and the barriers are many. COVID-19 has made the situation more dire.

- manage a growing portfolio of major donors based throughout the U.S. through a designed stream of cultivation and solicitation activities;
- participate in cultivation events and activities; and
- identify Major Gift prospects from the Direct Marketing base and work to engage them at a deeper level.

Development of New Markets

The Senior Manager, Major Gifts will

- raise awareness and support for Orbis in new markets with a focus on major gifts;
- design and execute strategies to engage Orbis's current stakeholders as well as new prospects;
- build strong relationships with donors, prospects, and networking partners; and
- garner unrestricted and restricted support while enhancing the Orbis image.

Design and Execution of Fundraising Strategies

The Senior Manager, Major Gifts will

- be a leader and expert for Orbis's major donor fundraising activities in the Americas region;
- in collaboration with the Director of Development, create and monitor progress against annual strategy, implementation plans, and targeted metric goals;
- design and implement online and offline strategies aimed at recruiting, retaining, and upgrading
 individual donors as well as enhancing the Orbis image and providing general education to the
 public; and
- collaborate and oversee proposal process for major donors in a personal portfolio.

Volunteers and Vendors

The Senior Manager, Major Gifts will

- identify and support volunteers to assist with prospect identification and cultivation; and
- coordinate work with any required outside vendor.

Global Collaboration

The Senior Manager, Major Gifts will

- collaborate with colleagues on local and global projects and initiatives as appropriate;
- liaise with colleagues in other Orbis fundraising offices to share innovations and best practices and, if needed, provide support; and

• interface with Orbis program colleagues around the world to understand donor demands and Orbis's organizational fundraising needs.
