When I look at our world and the building blocks of life such as cells and DNA, I know I am looking at the perfect plan of a master planner, the amazing design of a stellar designer, and the beautiful creation that belongs to a creator.

Does that require faith?

Yes. But so does evolution and spontaneous generation, which are the only other explanations for how life began.

Scientists cannot give an irrefutable answer to the question, "What caused the universe to begin?" and they've even admitted that the simplest living cell could not have arisen by chance.

If I were to believe these alternate theories, I would have to accept that: Nothing produces everything. Nonlife produces life. Chaos and chance led to design and order. The most complex and programmed systems just happened. That non-reason produced reason And that unconsciousness gave rise to consciousness

That's a lot of faith. And a lot of answered questions.

And so, I stand on the Word of the living God, who created this world and sent his Son to make a way for me to one day join him in heaven for all eternity.
