The Executive Director will rebuild and transform the team responsible for philanthropy earmarked for pan-University priorities, working with centrally based Directors of Development on their annual work plans, travel plans, goals, and pipeline development. Partnering with the Associate Vice President and Directors, the Executive Director will ensure that everyone works strategically, collaboratively, and efficiently internally and externally. The Executive Director will lead efforts to organize and hire key fundraisers for the University Priorities team and will supervise five director-level positions.

- build and manage a portfolio of current and prospective major- and principal-gift level donors, moving them towards giving levels that achieve annual and long-range fundraising goals for the University;
- coordinate prospect strategy and communication across a highly decentralized and complex advancement structure;
- create and oversee a strategy for effective prospect coordination within a quasi-regional approach to securing funding for University priorities;
- play a critical role in maximizing philanthropic support from key donors to ultimately achieve, or exceed, ambitious campaign goals;
- serve as a member of the senior leadership team in the University Development Office and maintain strong and meaningful relationships with advancement colleagues and leaders across Grounds;
- when travel restrictions are lifted, travel nationally to identify, cultivate, and solicit prospects;
- manage, lead, and coach staff.

PREFERRED COMPETENCIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

The University of Virginia seeks an Executive Director of Development with

- direct portfolio and performance management experience as well as campaign planning experience, particularly within a higher education setting;
- a track record of achieving sustained growth in a university, non-profit organization, or other relevant sector;
- a demonstrated commitment to diversity and inclusion;
- exceptional communication skills, a high degree of personal integrity and the ability to keep the big picture in focus while attending to the small details; and
- experience using data to evaluate and plan.

A bachelor's degree is required for this position as is at least eight years of relevant experience.
