## Session 12 at-a-Glance

As time goes on, there will come to be a tension between the need to keep earlier words and phrases alive (and growing stronger) and the need to learn new words and phrases. As a result there will be sessions when a smaller than average amount of new vocabulary is learned. This session is such a Session.

| Learning Activity | Description | Materials to Gather |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 1: Doing things to <br> creepy-crawlies <br> with tools (TPR) | This activity, like an earlier one, highlights the <br> noun forms for performing an action "with" an <br> instrument. It also reinforces the tool names <br> learned in the previous session. <br> The Nurturer instructs the GPs: "Kill the fly <br> with the hammer. Hit the mouse with the <br> hatchet. Kill the spider with the wrench. Kill <br> the cockroach with the string...." | names for pests learned previously that <br> are commonly killed by people (being <br> careful about cultural sensitivities): <br> mouse, fly, bee, snake, spider, <br> cockroach. Tools ffom the day before. <br> Remember that it is always easy to add <br> two or three new objects in such an <br> activity that is built mainly around old <br> objects. |
| record | 2: Mixing and <br> strengthening old <br> objects and <br> actions (TPR) | Eat, pour, drink, give, and the new action, feed <br> oneself, other GPs, the Nurturer, dolls, and <br> animals. Also, the foods can be cut with the <br> knife, hatchet, scissors, fork, and saw, and eaten <br> or fed to an animal or person with the fork, <br> spoon, or hand. This provides many more <br> options than most activities so far, if the <br> Nurturer can keep them all in mind. |
| Foods, drinks, dolls (man, woman, boy, <br> girl, baby), animals. |  |  |
| record | A GP performs many actions from the previous <br> activity, sing the same objects and actions. <br> The Nurturer describes what the GP is doing <br> right while he does it. This type of <br> here-and-now input is important in this early <br> stage, and such activities can be profitably <br> included more frequently than indicated here. <br> Maximum value comes from listening <br> repeatedly to the recording, or better, watching <br> the video. |  |
| 3: review <br> (Here-and-now) |  |  |
| record | record | The Nurturer instructs GPs: "Give three fish to <br> the woman. Give five matches to the baby...." <br> Of course, the activity starts with hon numbers <br> (probably one and two) and only adds one new <br> number at a time. |
| 4: numbers to ten <br> (TPR) | Some small objects that come in large <br> sets: matches, sunflower seeds, candies, <br> beans, dried anchovies. Dolls <br> (representing people). |  |
