The Senior Officer of Leadership Giving will work collaboratively and strategically with the International Director of Philanthropy to help ensure the organization fulfills its mission of ending cruelty to farm animals by identifying, cultivating, soliciting, and stewarding generous individuals and foundations.

Animal Equality is an international organization working with society, governments, and companies to end cruelty to farmed animals. As an animal protection organization, Animal Equality is guided by compassion, determination, and effectiveness. Using these values to launch innovative projects and strategic campaigns, it works to expose and abolish the cruel practices of the animal agriculture industry. Its teams in the United States, Germany, Italy, Spain, the United Kingdom, Mexico, Brazil, and India consist of highly qualified professionals with years of experience in undercover investigations, corporate campaigns, legal advocacy, and the development of large-scale education programs. It is committed to saving as many animals as possible and to reducing the enormous suffering animals endure on factory farms. Animal Equality's commitment to continually assessing the impact of its campaigns and programs makes it increasingly efficient at saving lives.

Animal Equality works strategically in four distinct areas to ensure progress for animals.

Investigations. Investigations are the most powerful tool Animal Equality has to expose the cruel and abusive treatment of animals inside the secretive world of industrial animal agriculture. Its undercover investigators document and help end horrific animal abuse. Their work is frequently featured in the media, encouraging consumers to make more informed decisions each time they choose what to eat. It also persuades policymakers and companies to make meaningful changes for animals.

Education. Individuals have the power to choose kindness over cruelty every time they sit down to eat. Online or on the ground, Animal Equality's outreach team is encouraging people all around the world to reduce or eliminate their meat consumption and replace it with delicious plant-based foods.

Corporate Outreach. Corporations large and small have the power to improve the lives of millions of farmed animals with just one policy reform. Animal Equality's corporate outreach department encourages businesses to implement meaningful animal protections that will significantly reduce the suffering of animals by ending some of the cruelest standard practices on factory farms and at the slaughterhouse.

Legal Advocacy. Animal Equality works to advance animal protection by ensuring that existing laws and regulations are strictly enforced.

ANIMAL EQUALITY'S COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

Diversity and inclusion have been embedded in Animal Equality's values since it was founded in 2006. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Senior Officer of Leadership Giving will

- meet ambitious fundraising targets by developing and executing successful customized major donor acquisition, cultivation, and solicitation strategies;
- identify, qualify, cultivate, and solicit current high-capacity prospective donors through face-toface meetings, events, emails, phone calls, and other strategic communications;

- prepare successful funding proposals and customized donor impact reports;
- work across departments to gain a thorough knowledge of programs and communicate that information to funders through proposals, reports, meetings, and in-person visits;
- develop annual goals with work plans, timelines, and budgets for meeting revenue goals and manage and monitor monthly progress toward achieving goals;
- maintain donor and prospect records in Salesforce database, including ongoing updates to donor and prospect constituent records; and
- work with the International Director of Philanthropy and United States development team to help plan and execute logistics for donor cultivation and recognition events, maintaining up-to-date knowledge of trends in the philanthropy field.

- an ability to think strategically, problem solve, manage multiple tasks concurrently, and develop new ways to improve organizational effectiveness in a fast-paced environment;
- an ability to communicate effectively in a manner that will attract new supporters to invest in Animal Equality's mission;
- an ability to work collaboratively with others in a team-oriented work environment and manage conflict with excellent interpersonal skills;
- a high degree of ethics and an ability to align behavior with the values of the organization;
- excellent organizational skills and attention to detail;
- a high degree of computer literacy and experience with a fundraising CRM, preferably Salesforce;
- a desire to grow, learn, and improve the organization and oneself.

A least six years of major gifts fundraising experience at a non-profit advocacy organization is required for this position as is an adherence to a vegan lifestyle.
